Educating vaccine-hesitant parents about the importance of childhood immunizations could prevent them from delaying or skipping recommended vaccines, say the authors of a study.

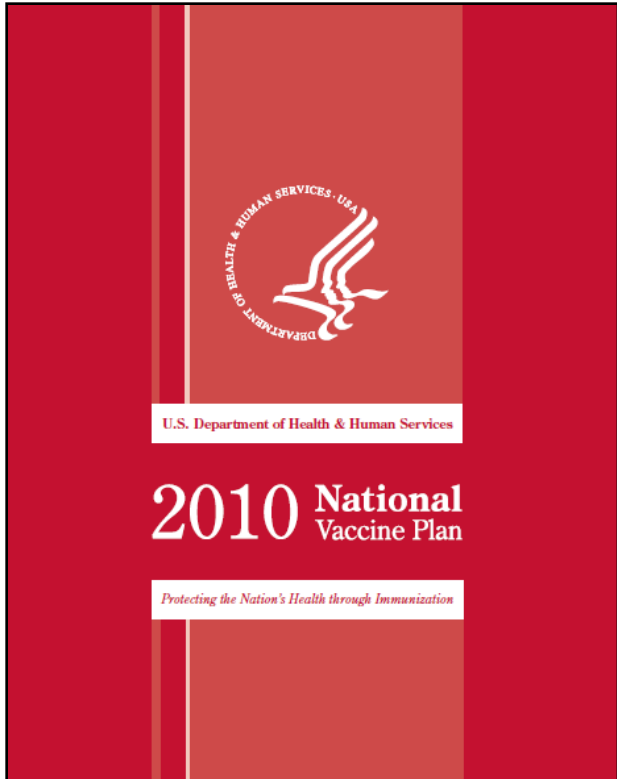
