The Cancer Prevention and Research Institute of Texas

- ★ Created by a statewide vote in 2007
- ★ Invest \$3 billion over 10 years in defeating cancer
- ★ Funded by general obligation bonds
- ★ 387 awards totaling \$670 million since January 2010





Texas Goals

- ★ Expedite innovation and commercialization in the area of cancer research
- ★ Enhance access to evidence-based prevention programs and services throughout the state
- ★ Attract Top Talent and High-Quality New Jobs in Texas

CPRIT's Matching Requirement

“Before the Cancer Prevention and Research Institute of Texas may make a grant of any proceeds of the bonds issued under this section, the recipient of the grant must have an amount of funds equal to one-half the amount of the grant dedicated to the research that is the subject of the grant request.” - Texas Constitution, Article III, Section 67

- Also addressed in TX Health & Safety Code, Ch. 102, Sec. 102.255 (CPRIT's Administrative Rules)
- Explained in CPRIT Policy and Procedures Guide for Grant Applications and Awards

CPRIT's Match in Application

- ★ **Who?** CPRIT looks to the institution.
- ★ **What?** “Dedicated to the research that is the subject of the grant request...” Match can be made using five cancer research categories.
- ★ **Where?** Match can come from anyone involved with grant (subcontractors, collaborators, etc.)
- ★ **When?** Match is required when contract is executed, not when application is submitted.
- ★ **How much?** Match can either be certified for the total award amount or on a year-by-year basis.
