WORKSHOP CONTEXT

More than half of the world's population lives in cities; however, the international development community has largely concentrated on rural populations, and United Nations agencies have remained predominately focused on national level plans and programs. While these models remain important, the United Nations and the international community have acknowledged the importance of the urban context for development policy and planning and for achieving national and global development goals for 2030 and beyond. The purpose of this workshop is draw attention to the health determinants and inequities of populations living in urban environments and the challenges faced in establishing urban population health. It will also illuminate some of the intervention strategies that have been designed to attenuate these urban health issues and will highlight the importance of public-private partnerships and the role of urban level governance in such remediation efforts.

Through facilitating discussion from those in both the public and private sector, as well as those in positions of governance, it will set the platform to share best practices on how to address health challenges through interventions that target healthier urban populations. Presentations and discussions will identify the role of cities in planetary health; the determinants of health and health inequities found in urban environments; global health transitions that focus on the urban context; the evidence and challenges of urban health initiatives; the effects of urbanization and urban planning on health; the effects of food, agriculture, and transportation systems on urban population health; and the roles of digital technology and AI in improving urban health.
