



The 1752 Commitment Statement

The 1752 Group commits to participating actively in the Action Collaboratives work. The Group commits to sharing information about the organization's efforts and innovations around preventing and addressing sexual harassment; and to use, adapt, implement, and share the resources and practices that are identified or published by the Action Collaborative (either published on the website or described at the annual Public Summit) where appropriate to our work and to other groups and organisations.

The 1752 Group is a UK-based research, consulting and campaign organisation established in 2016. The group is dedicated to ending staff sexual misconduct in higher education. Our work includes research, policy development, and activism. The 1752 Group has written journal articles, the first sector guidance on staff sexual misconduct in higher education, and partnered with the National Union of Students on the first student survey of experiences of staff sexual misconduct in the UK. In partnership with law firm McAllister Olivarius the Group wrote the first UK sector guidelines on reporting, investigations and decision-making procedures (March 2020). These resources are all freely available on our website. We offer training and consultancy to organisations within the higher education sector. In 2019 we co-organised the International Faculty and Staff Sexual Misconduct Conference held at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, which brought together scholars, lawyers, activists and experts working in support organisations.

We are committed to working with a range of local and international partner organisations, including both higher education and service organisations, and we prioritise working with groups that are survivor-focused.
