Meeting Overview: To bring together representatives from the CONSORT Clinical Network performing hand or face transplantation to achieve **consensus** on the process, procedures, and protocols across the eight (8) CONSORT Focus Areas. Emphasis will be placed on **standardization of metrics and measures** to define functional, immunologic, psychosocial/quality-of-life, and graft/patient survival outcomes across preoperative, intraoperative, and postoperative phases.

Focus Areas

- 1. Inclusion & Exclusion Criteria: Align criteria with a "whole health" approach
- 2. **Patient Education**: Develop standardized education toolkit
- 3. Surgical Protocols: Develop universal protocols while allowing site-specific innovation
- 4. Immunosuppressive Regimens: Define common baseline regimen, explore novel agents
- 5. **Rehabilitation**: Create guidelines for specialized postoperative rehabilitation
- 6. Outcome Metrics: Standardize objective/functional measures
- 7. Quality of Life: Establish consensus on psychosocial and quality-of-life indicators
- 8. Data Reporting & VCA-NET Database: Discuss uniform data collection and reporting requirements
