To transform service delivery systems to improve the education, employment, housing and physical or mental well-being of the region's disconnected 16-24 year old population.

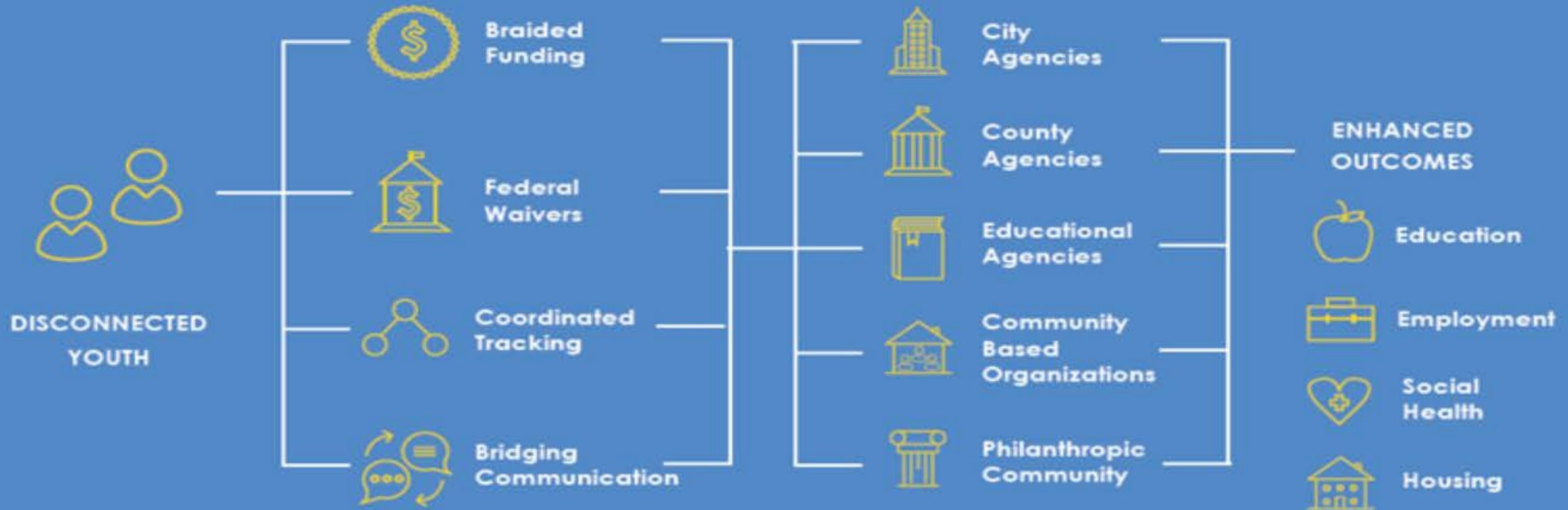
VISION

The P3 Model



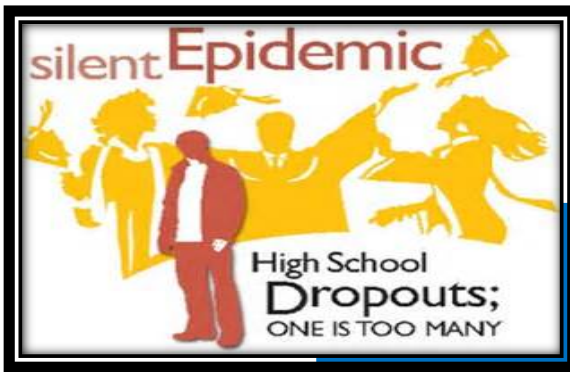
P3 Partnership - YouthSource



A collaborative effort between the Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD) and the City of Los Angeles Economic and Workforce Development Department established in 2012.

P3 EXPANDED INITIATIVE TO OVER 40 PUBLIC AND PRIVATE AGENCIES:

- Build system of referrals and coordination in local geographic areas
- To link youth job readiness programs, education and training with housing, mental health and social support. Expanded service and co-location of services are key.

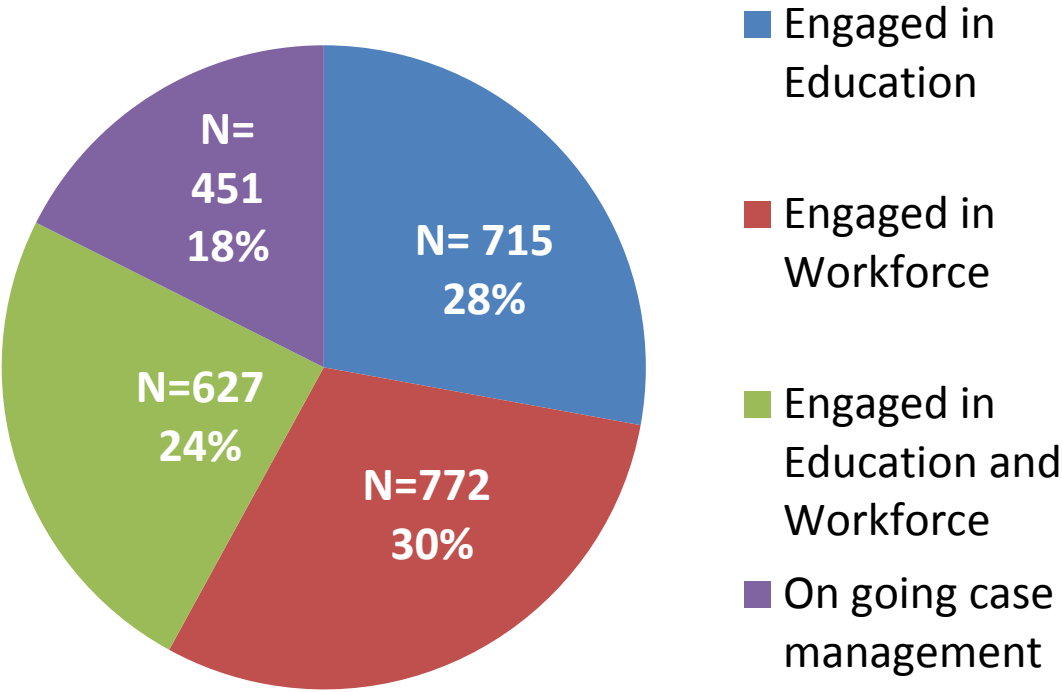

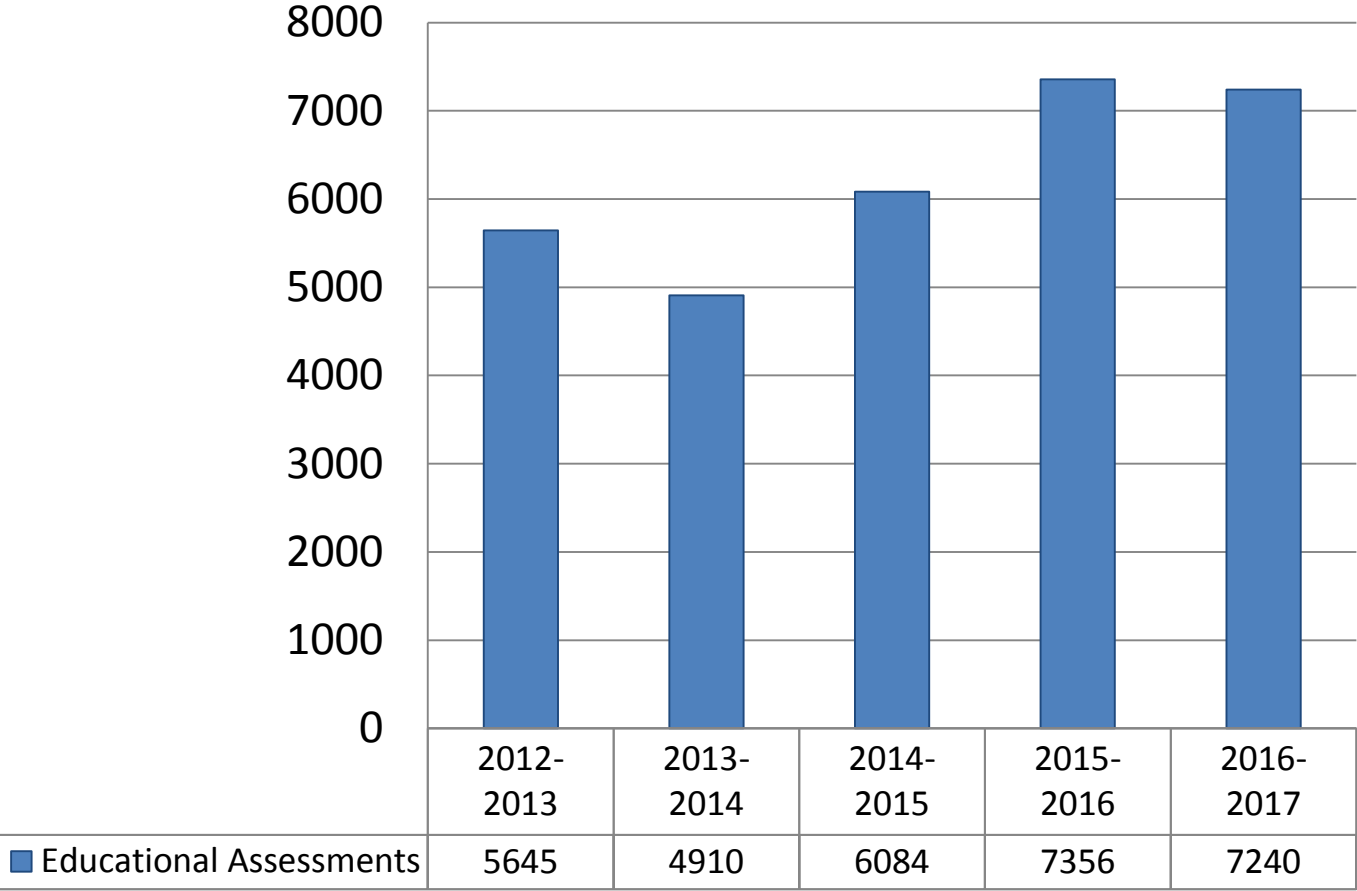
