

Mayor Bowser's Fiscal Year 2022 budget proposal will include a 3.6% increase to the uniform per student funding formula (UPSFF), for a total of more than \$2 billion to serve an estimated 98,528 students in DC's traditional public schools and public charter schools.

Additionally, in the fall of 2021, we expect all public schools in Washington, DC to fully open for in-person learning, five days a week, with all educators back in the classroom.

Beyond Reopening is Readiness

The DC Comprehensive School Behavioral Health Model

- Is a coordinated behavioral health system designed to create a positive school culture that promotes mental wellness and provides timely access to high-quality services for children, youth, and their families.
- Is a comprehensive school behavioral health system, which is a strategic collaboration between school personnel, community mental health providers, students, and families.
- Allows school-based teams to offer a full array of traumainformed, culturally-responsive, evidence-based tiered_{OSSE slides} interventions to promote wellness, identify challenges

Tier 2


Targeted Prevention

- MTSS is a data-driven, problem-solving framework to improve outcomes for all students.
 - MTSS relies on a continuum of evidence-based practices matched to student needs
 - These tiers refer to levels of support students receive, not to students themselves.

Referral Pathway Process

• The route and coordinating timeline that a student follows when entering a earment.

- Self-referral by student
- Parent
- School Staff
- Community provider

Referral

Consultation

- Interviews
- Observations
- Behavioral Health Screening

- Triage Identify appropriate level of care
- Identify treatment provider (school, CBO, external provider)

Treatment

Termination

- Prepare student for transition to a reduced level of care
- Take steps to discharge or downgrade level of care
