Service Limitations

(e.g., assessment, goals, location of services, parent training)

Clinical Process Barriers

(e.g., re-referral, excessive documentation requirements, peer review/medical team conferences)











Administrative Barriers Impacting Access to Care

#1: Credentialing of RBTs

RBT Requirements



No grace period



Directly impacts access to care

Tricare Credentialing of RBTs



Lengthy process



Directly impacts access to care



Wait times up to 1 year!





Administrative Barriers

#2: Revenue Collection Management

Claims

25 - 30%

Parent training participation limited to non-direct care and supervision dates of services.



#4: Limitation on Treatment Goal Selection





Continuity of Care

"to ensure continuity of care, sufficient ABA treatment and consultation should be delivered in subsequent educational and therapeutic settings to successfully support and transition individuals" (CASP, 2020)



Locations

ABA services may be provided: home, school, community, center, residential, hospital/inpatient



Tricare Authorization

Tricare ONLY Authorizes Home (No school, no community)
