


























RI Resilience – State + Local Collaboration

Municipal Resilience Program

- Launched in 2019 as a collaboration between RI Infrastructure Bank and The Nature Conservancy
- Community Resilience Building Workshops:
 - Identify community hazards, strengths, vulnerabilities, and priority actions
 - Develop localized resilience strategies
 - 1600+ Resilience Actions identified to date
- MRP Action Grants:
 - Fund design and construction of capital projects with resilience benefits
 - \$19.4mm in Action Grant funding awarded to date
- Project Pipeline:
 - Support municipalities to identify further funding/financing sources
- In 2023, RIDEM partnered in this process with the state's CRO transition



Chief Resilience Officer – Executive Order 23-07

The Department of Environmental Management shall recruit and hire an individual to serve as the Rhode Island Chief Resilience Officer.

- Coordinate resilience efforts across state agencies, municipalities, businesses, and other organizations and to advise the RI Executive Climate Change Coordinating Council (RIEC4), established pursuant to R.I. General Laws § 42-6.2-1, on the status and effectiveness of those efforts;
- Draft state policies on resilience and implement such policies under the direction of the RIEC4;
- Serve as the primary voice and advocate for state actions on resilience;
- Build upon the planning assistance provided to municipalities by MRP workshops, in coordination with partner agencies;
- Work closely with RIIB on the MRP Action Grants and the planning and financing of other resilience projects;
- Work with RIIB and CRMC on the implementation of the OSCAR grant program;
- Plan and implement projects to protect and restore the habitat and recreational resources owned or under the stewardship of DEM;
- Aggressively track and apply for federal grants to fund resilience efforts across Rhode Island;
- Coordinate resilience efforts with decarbonization programs, activities, and policies taken in accordance with the RI Act on Climate;
 and
- **Provide biennial reports** to the RIEC4, the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the President of the Senate on the State of Resilience in Rhode Island, with the **first report to be submitted by December 31, 2024**.

Chief Resilience Officer – Mission

Three Core Goals: Elevation, Collaboration, and Transparency



Collaboration on resilience solutions at Fogland Point in Tiverton with Save the Bay

- Elevate local resilience needs, seeking funding and policy solutions to address these needs
- Foster collaboration & coordination on resilience efforts statewide, spanning agencies and organizations
- 3. Increase transparency and accessibility of resilience information

- 1. Expanding resilience support to all 39 municipalities
- 2. Aligning further with **existing planning processes**
- Increasing community engagement in resilience planning processes



Resilience Implementation

Resilience Design & Engineering Assistance

- Partnership between RIDEM, RIIB, The Nature Conservancy, Save the Bay, and consultant Weston & Sampson
- Two stages 1. Site Visioning (on-the-ground site visits with guidance from environmental consultants)
 2. Conceptual Design (putting pen to paper in preparation for upcoming funding opportunities)
- Launched May 6th 2024; Site Submittals due May 24th (4 Yes/No Eligibility Qs)

State + Federal Resilience Grants:

- State Grants: Climate Resilience Fund; Ocean State Climate Adaptation + Resilience Fund;
 Municipal Resilience Program Action Grants
- Federal Funding: NOAA CRRC application submitted Feb 2024 (\$55mm); NFWF NCRF Letter of Intent submitted April 2024 (\$10mm)

State Resilience Funding, cont.

1. OSCAR (Ocean State Climate Adaptation & Resilience) Grants

- Eligible Projects: Planning, Design & Construction projects that deliver climate resilience benefit, habitat restoration benefit, and public access benefit (Removal/Relocation of vulnerable infrastructure, Restoration of river & stream floodplains, Revegetation, Land Acquisition, Redesign/Resizing/Replacement of culverts/bridge spans at wetland crossings, etc.)
- Funds Available: \$4mm available (Spring 2024 RFP live applications due June 21st 2024) | No Match Required

2. Climate Resilience Fund Grants

- Eligible Projects: Design & Construction projects that deliver climate resilience benefit (Removal/Redesign/Relocation of vulnerable infrastructure, Green Infrastructure & Nature-Based Solutions); some Planning costs considered
- Funds Available: \$4.3mm awarded to date | \$1mm available (May-June 2024 RFP anticipated) |
 \$2mm anticipated through 2024 State Green Bond | 25% Match Required

3. Municipal Resilience Program Action Grants

- Eligible Projects: Design & Construction projects that deliver climate resilience benefit (Removal/Redesign/Relocation of vulnerable infrastructure, Green Infrastructure & Nature-Based Solutions)
- Funds Available: \$19.4mm awarded to date | \$5mm available (May-June 2024 RFP anticipated) |
 \$10mm anticipated through 2024 State Green Bond | 25% Match Required

Resilience Grant Outcomes



MRP Action Grant - Watershed Restoration at the Bristol Golf Course

- Restoring ponds and impoundments
- Removing fill and culverts
- Daylighting streams
- Restoring a buffer of native shrubs, trees, and grasses






MRP Action Grant – SWIFCAP I – Stormwater Inland Flooding Climate Adaptation Project #1

- Re-contoured and installed stormwater management BMPs along the roadside of Anthony Road
- Rehabilitated catch basins
- Installed rain gardens and restored existing wetlands

NOAA Climate Resilience Regional Challenge

- RIDEM coordinated a \$55mm Track 2 Implementation application
 - 39 collaborators and 11 subawardees
- Across four key activities, supports
 - Landmark Resilience Projects
 - Community Engagement, Workforce Development, and Knowledge Transfer
 - Resilience Funding Programs (Grants)
 - Regional Resilience Coordinators
- Submitted LOI August 2023, which was one of 120 of 900 to be accepted
- Submitted Full Application February 2024
- Expected to hear Summer 2024

- NOAA CRRC application submitted Feb 2024


EC4 Resilience Collaboration
