Thomas F. Thornton is Director of the Board on Environmental Change and Society at the National Academies. An environmental anthropologist, Tom has worked with North Pacific Indigenous peoples, communities, and governments on environmental perception, resource, change, and governance issues, particularly in Alaska, since 1989. While Director of the Environmental Change & Management program and Senior Research Fellow at University of Oxford's Environmental Change Institute (2008-18), he trained interdisciplinary postgraduate students from more than 70 countries and researched and published on numerous environmental change and society issues in Europe, Asia, Africa, and the Americas. Tom has also served as Dean of the School of Arts & Sciences, Vice Provost for Research, Professor of Environment and Society, and Director of the Alaska Coastal Rainforest Center at University of Alaska Southeast. He has authored or edited seven books and over 100 academic articles on environment and society issues.
