

# Evidence to Advance Reform in the Global Security and Justice Sectors: A Workshop-based Consensus Study Series

## August 9, 2022

National Academy of Sciences Building, 2101 Constitution Avenue NW, Washington, DC

**Purpose:** This public session is designed to discuss the research implications of recent reports published through the National Academies by the Committee on Evidence to Advance Reform in the Global Security and Justice Sectors. The committee was assembled at the request of Bureau of International Narcotics and Law Enforcement Affairs (INL), U.S. Department of State, to review, assess, and reach consensus on existing evidence on policing institutions, police practices and capacities, and police legitimacy in the international context. The committee was tasked to produce a series of five reports addressing specific questions of interest to INL. This session examines research directions set forth in the committee's first three reports on the following questions:

1. What organizational policies, structures, or practices (e.g., HR and recruiting, legal authorities, reporting lines, etc.) enable a police service to promote the rule of law and protect the population?
2. What are the core knowledge and skills needed for police to promote the rule of law and protect the population? What is known about mechanisms (e.g., basic and continuing education or other capacity building programs) for developing the core skills needed for police to promote the rule of law and protect the population?
3. What policies and practices for police use of force are effective in promoting the rule of law and protecting the population (including officers themselves)? What is known about effective practices for implementing those policies and practices in recruitment, training, and internal affairs?
