Describe the last time you interacted with a police officer.


N = 104 Chicagoans I recruited off the street who interacted with the police within the last year, said...

e.g., ride-alongs, interviews

Phase 2: Identifying reasons for failure

How are you doing?

What are you up to?

Reason: An illusion of rapport

There is no way for a friendly and polite demeanor to put people at ease if their predominant experience is a more aggressive policing style.

Modeling Real Life

- Involved community members and rank-and-file officers to scout locations where police interactions were frequent
 - Five experimental areas in community, occluded from each other

Transparency condition:

"Hi, I'm Officer [Name], how's it going? I'm walking around trying to get to know the community. Can I talk to you for a minute?"

"Hello, I'm just out and about walking around, talking to people in the community."

"...I'm just taking a walk, trying to get to know my community better."

"...I'm just walking around getting to know like everybody that's hanging out in the area."








Interaction & Recovery Baseline

<u>Control condition</u>: "Hi, I'm Officer [Name], how's it going? Can I talk to you for a minute?"




