- Intermediate Term Objectives (before release)
  - Identify & Address Needs of Users of DHC:
    - User Centric Communication
      - Fitness for Use
      - What will DAS be "tuned" to?
    - **User Centric** Strategies & Resources
      - What will be best practices for using 2020 DHC data effectively?
      - What strategies/methods can be used to assess margins of error?
      - Who will provide these tools?
      - Least resourced largest negative effect
- Long Term Objectives beyond scope but critical
  - Concerns about Census loss of credibility
    - Mix of 2020 challenges, Disclosure Avoidance
  - Planning for 2030 A better plan
    - 2020 not a precedent
