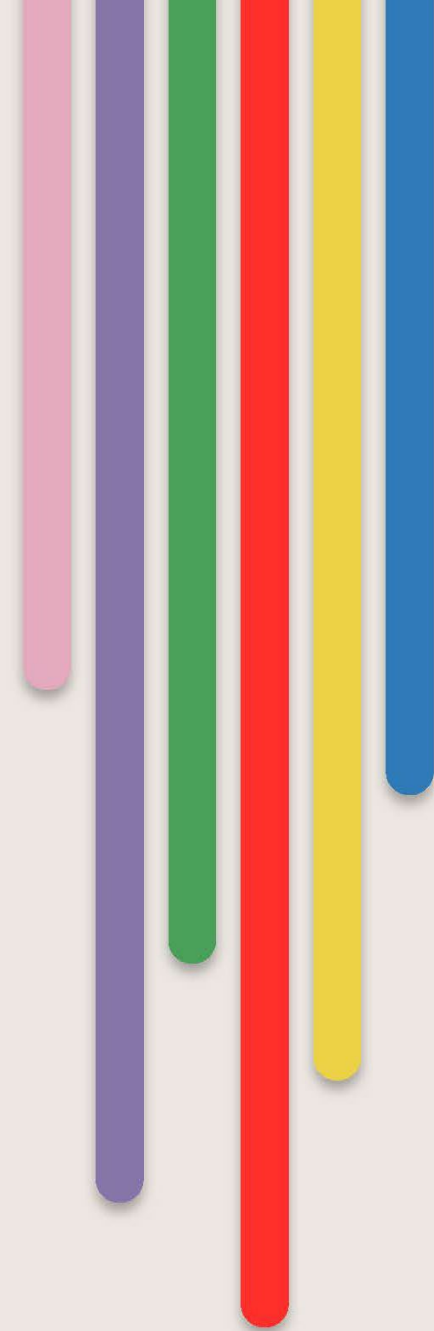
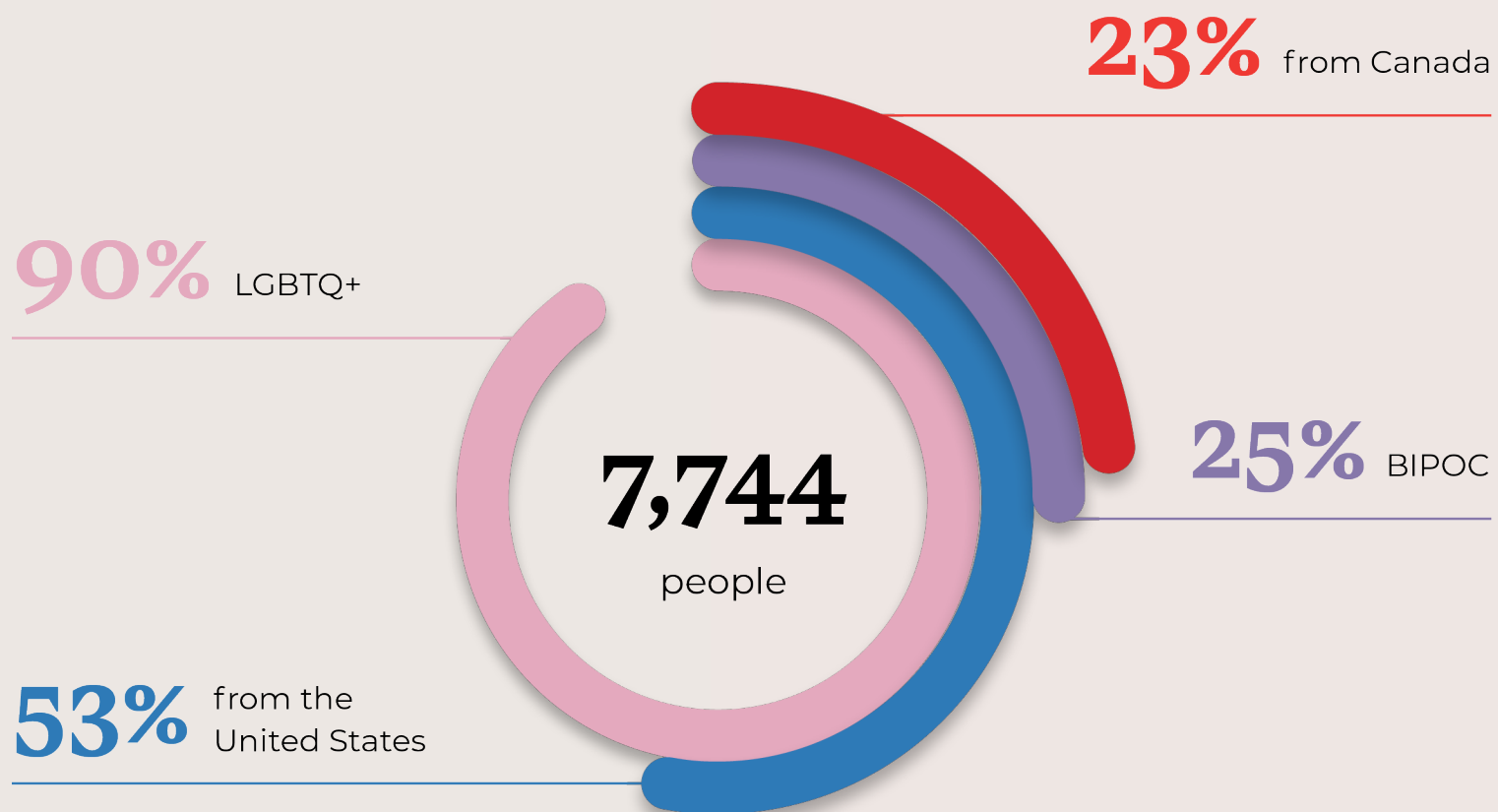

want to get vaccinated



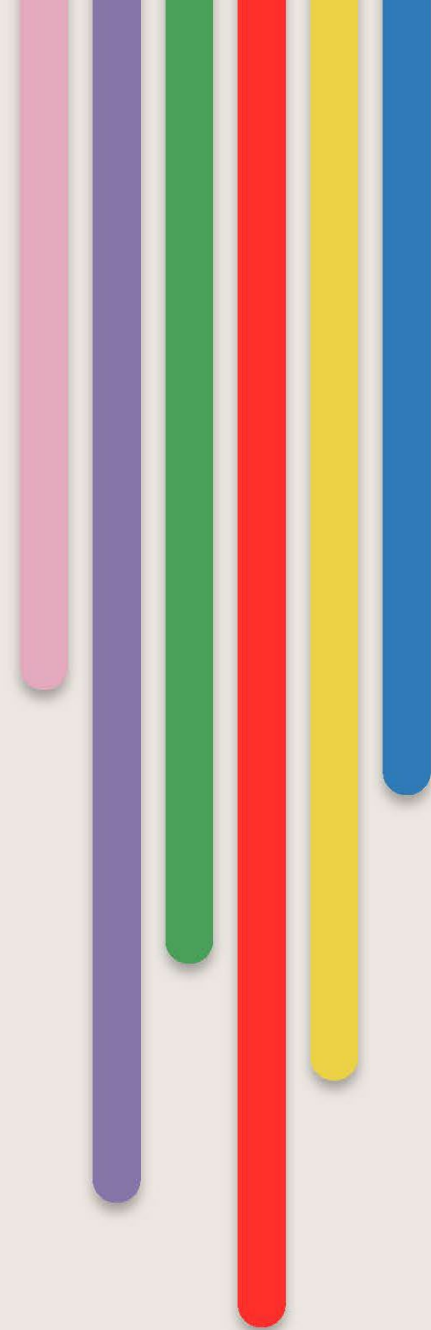
The most important reason to get vaccinated is to

“protect others”



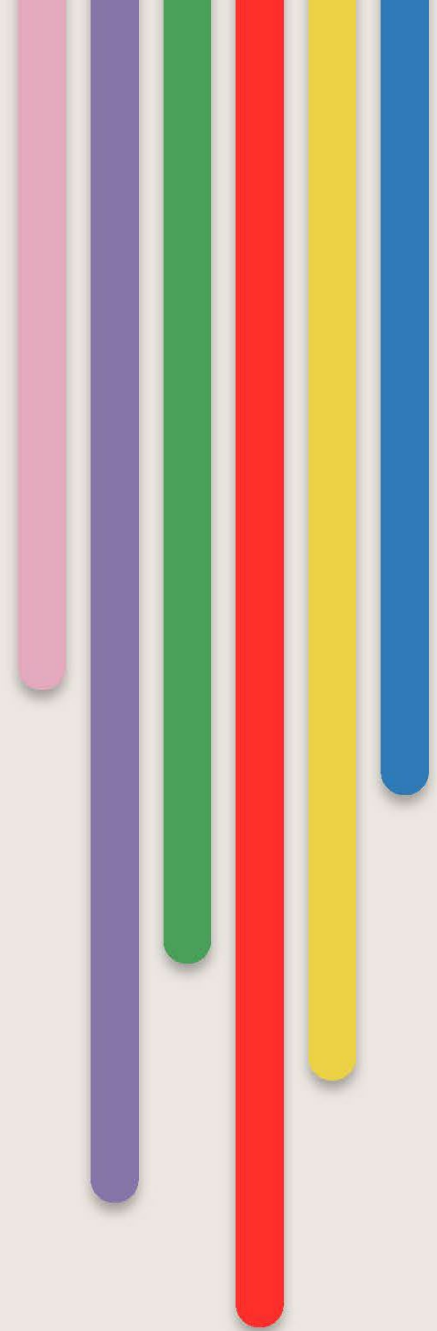
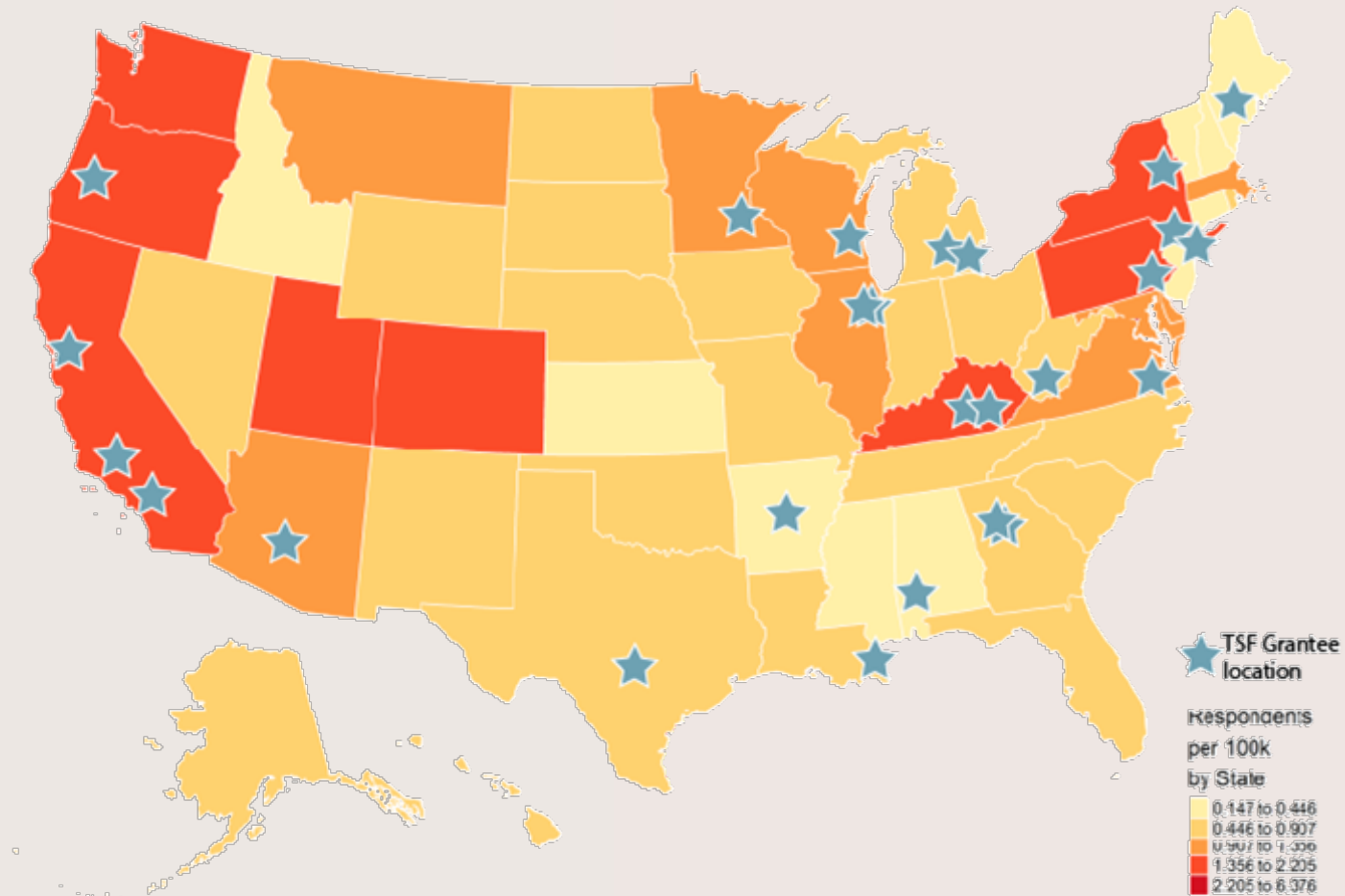
Vaccination providers need to understand the unique needs of our community

“It sucks going to these clinics and being misgendered or having them ask sex assigned at birth. Why is that relevant to me getting a shot?”

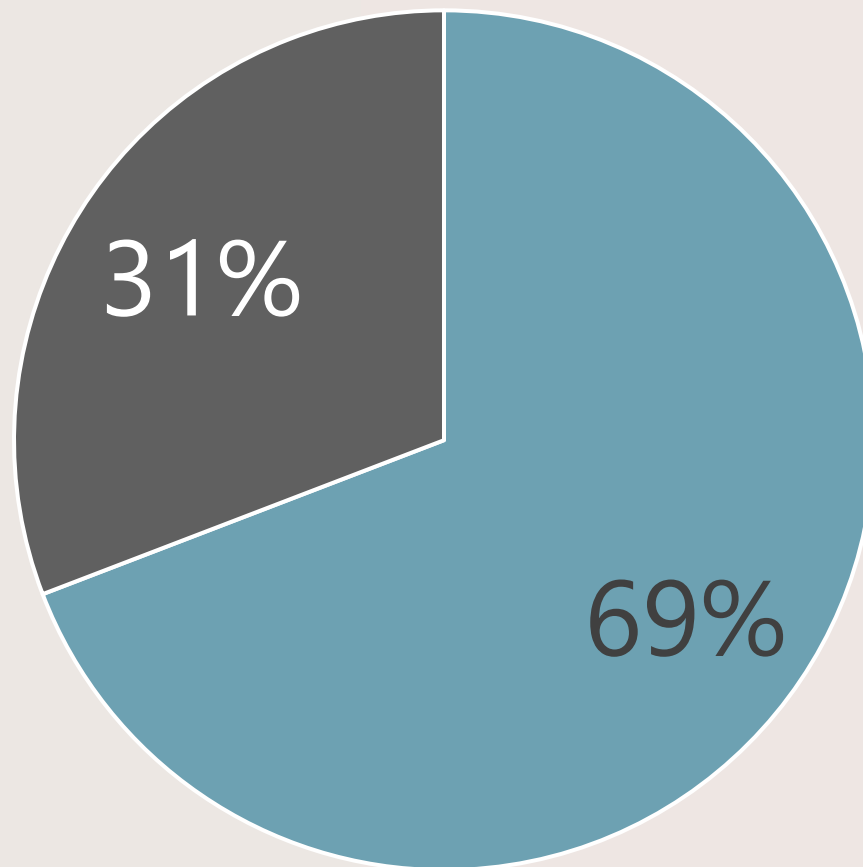


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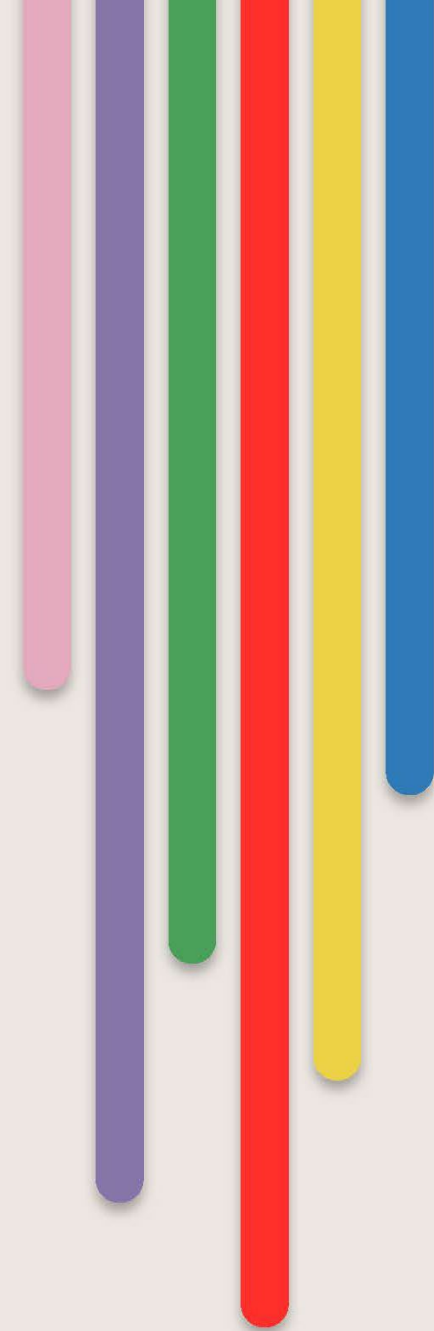
Responses per capita



US Vaccination Status

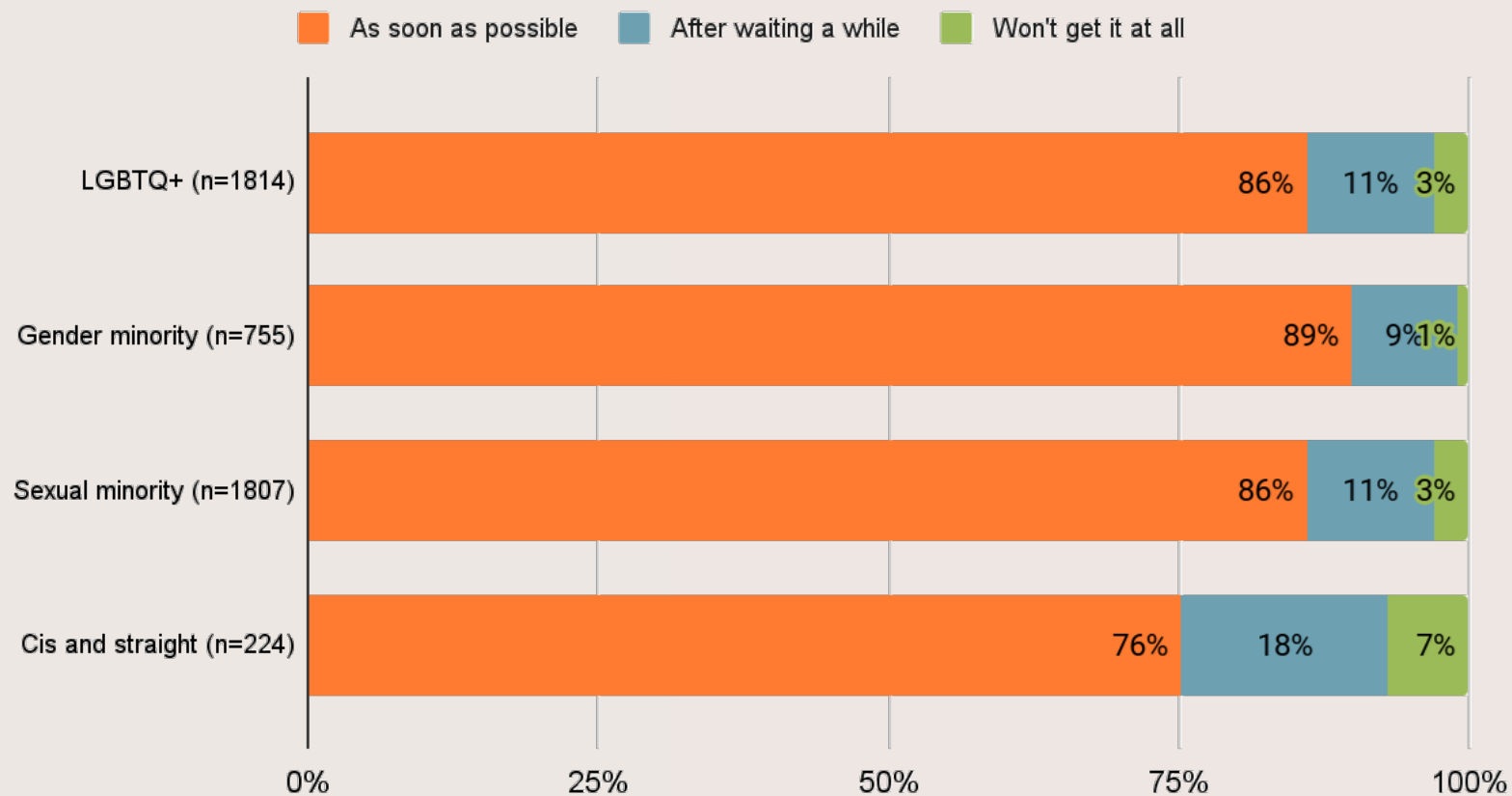


■ Already vaccinated ■ Not yet vaccinated



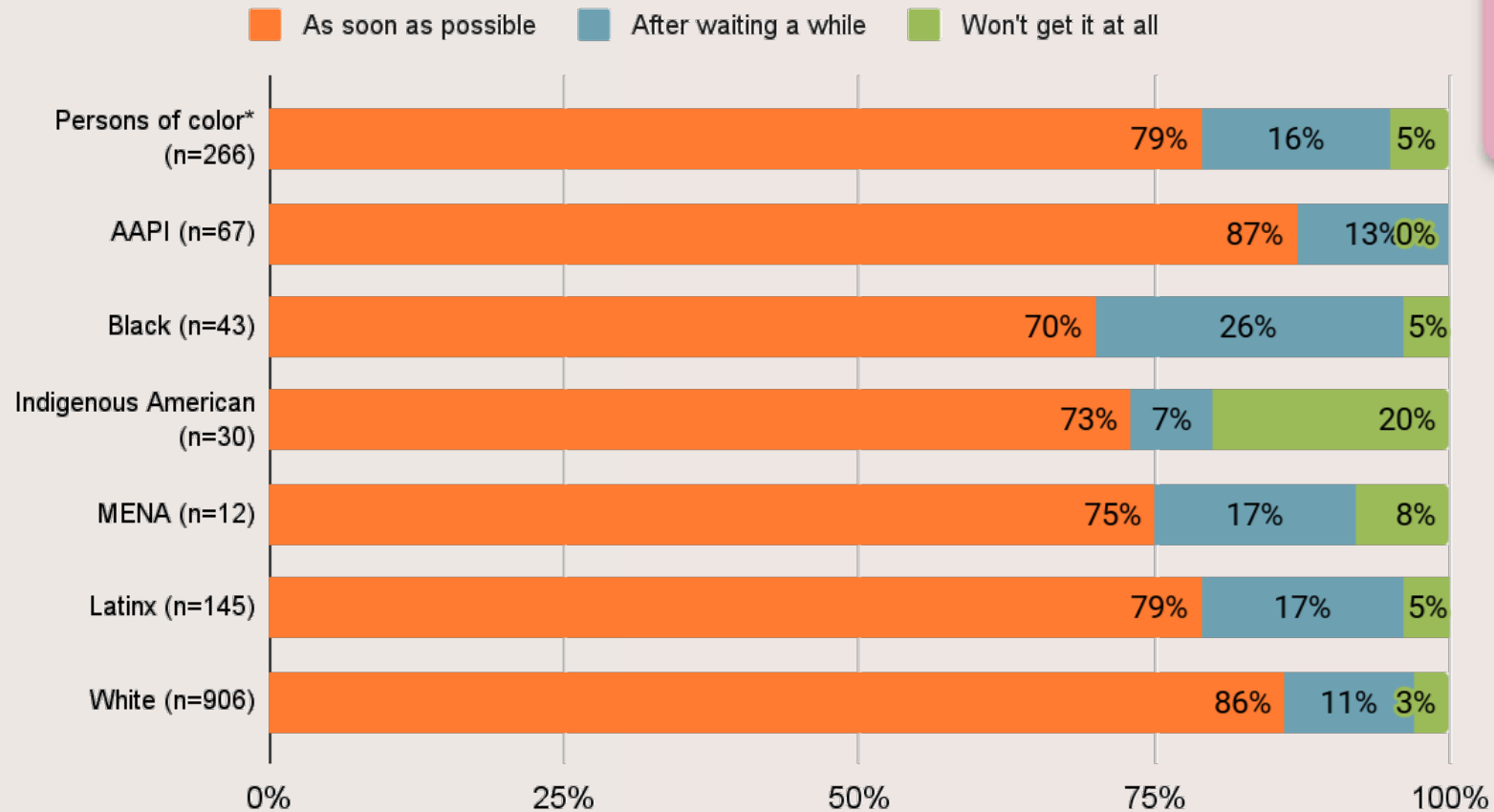
LGBTQ+ people want to get vaccinated

How soon will you get a COVID-19 vaccination?



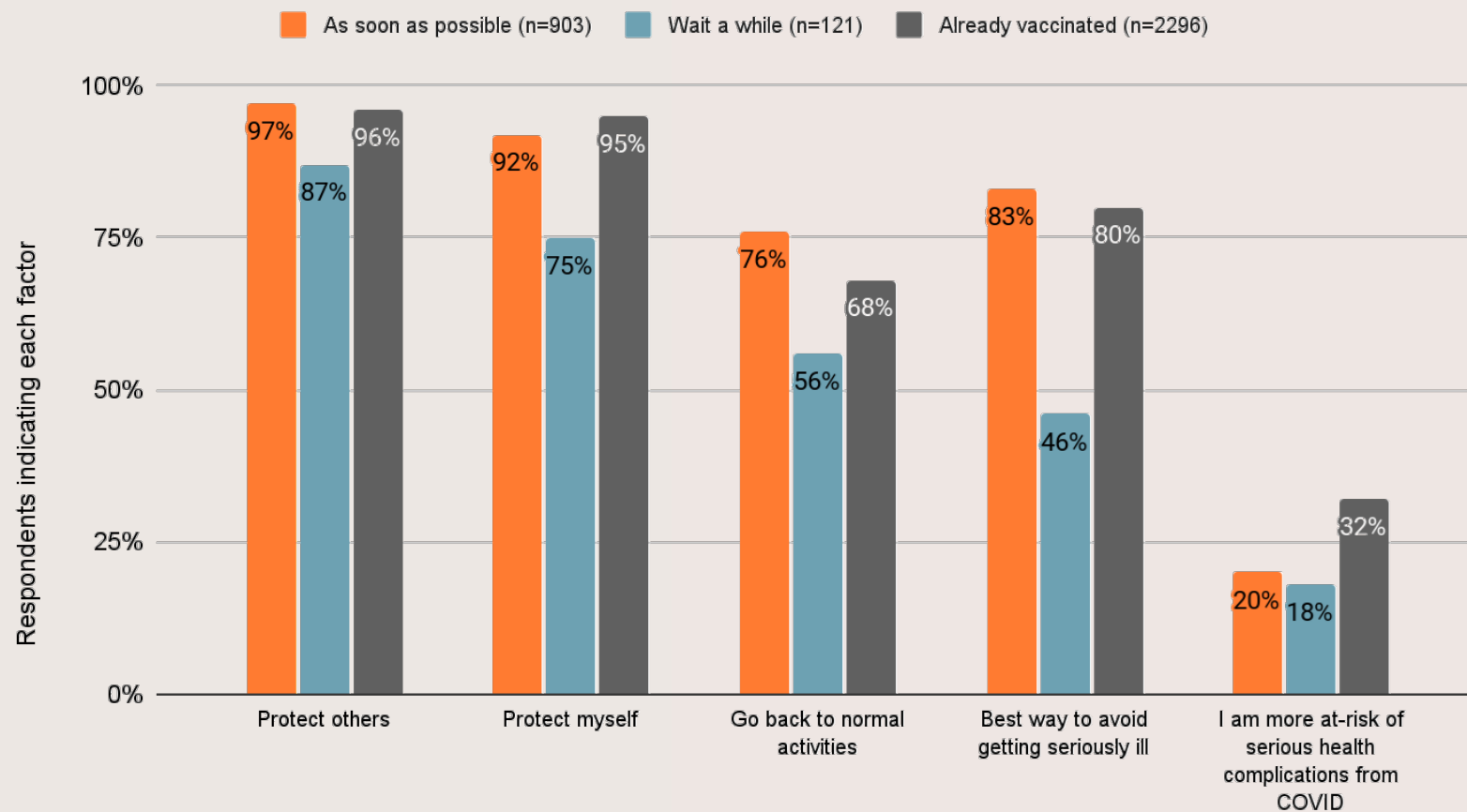
LGBTQ+ people of color are more likely to wait to be vaccinated

How soon will you get a COVID-19 vaccination?



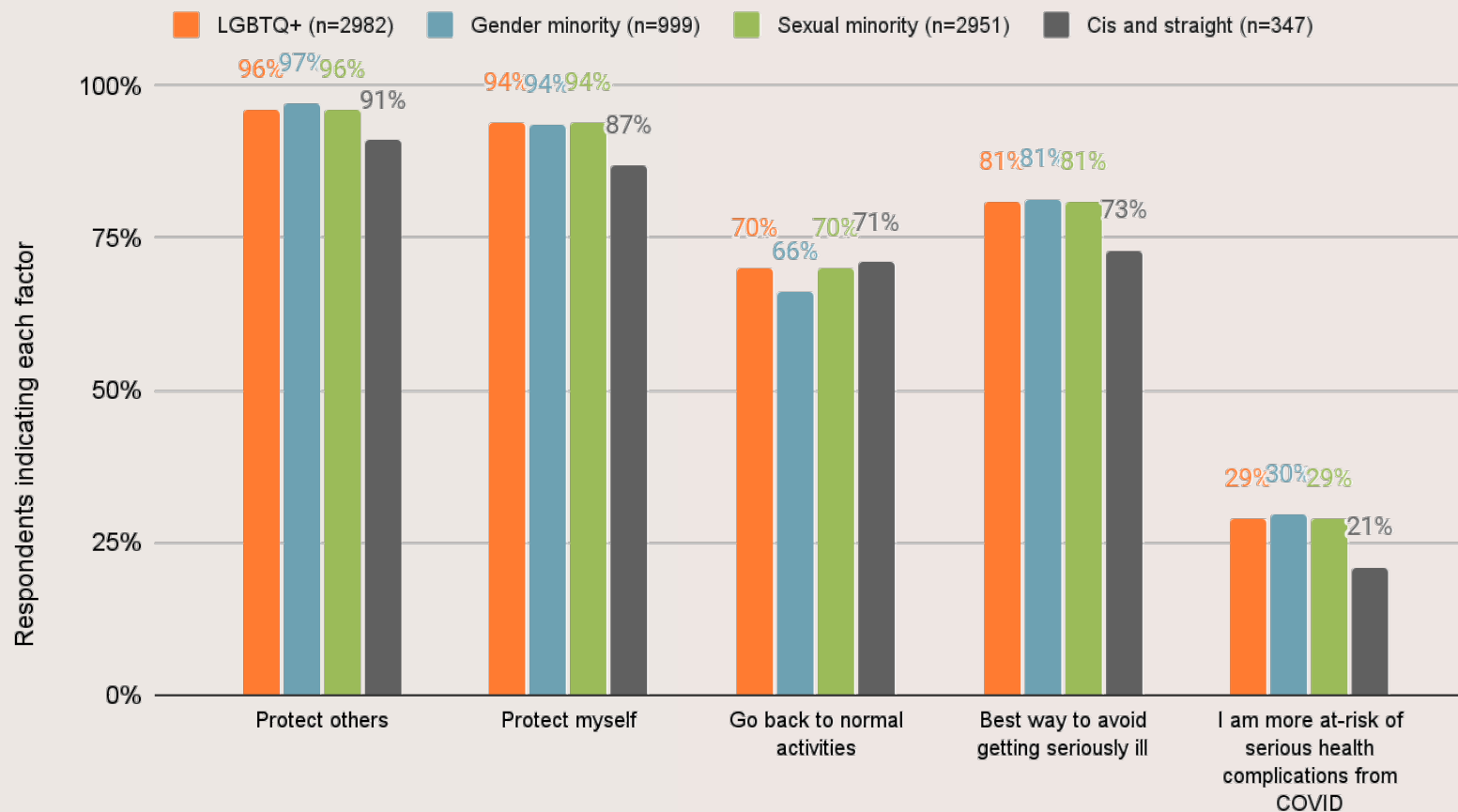
Protecting the community encourages “waiters” to get vaccinated

Why will you/did you get vaccinated?



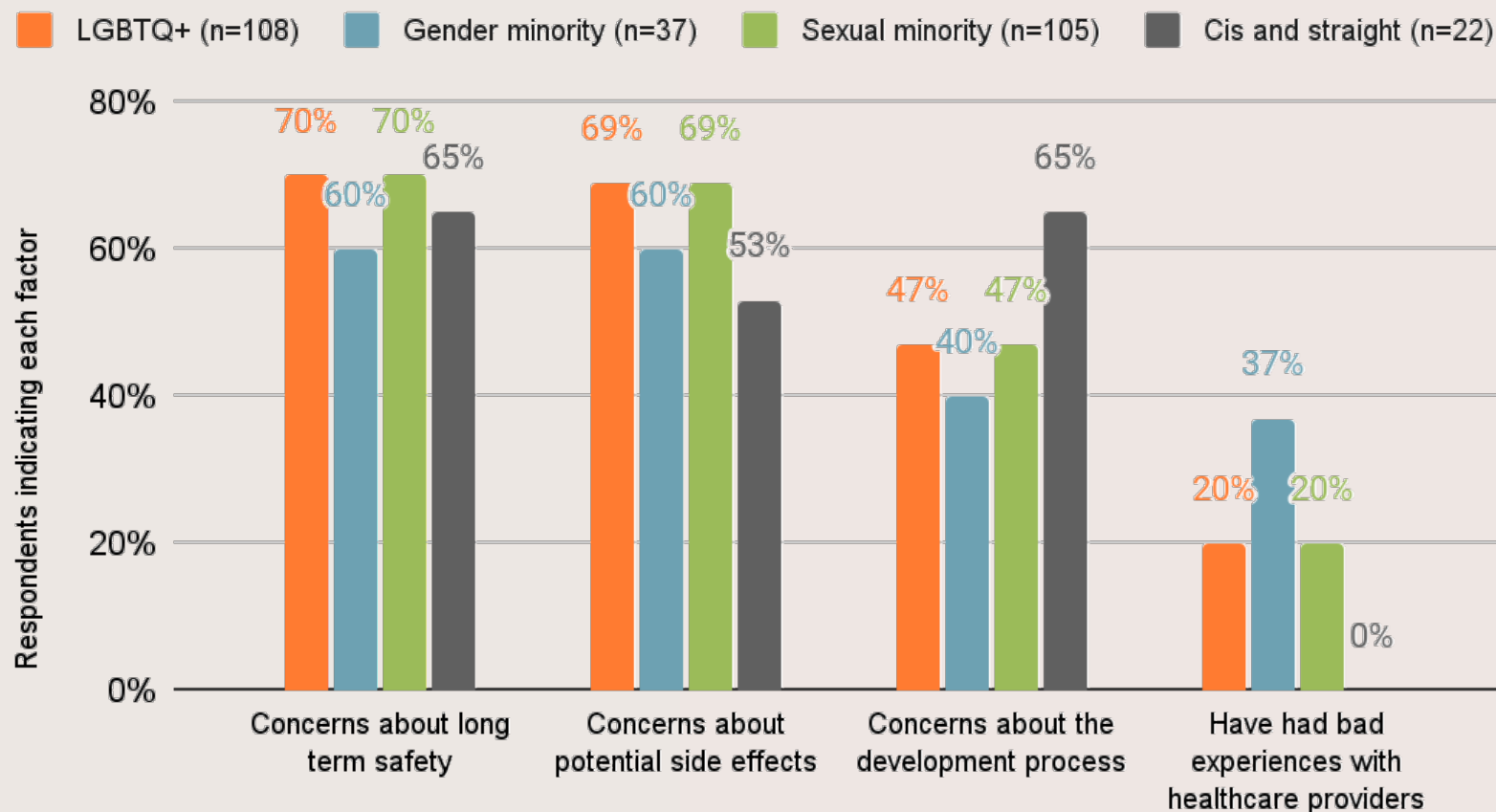
Protecting the community is particularly important among LGBTQ+ people

Why will you/did you get vaccinated?



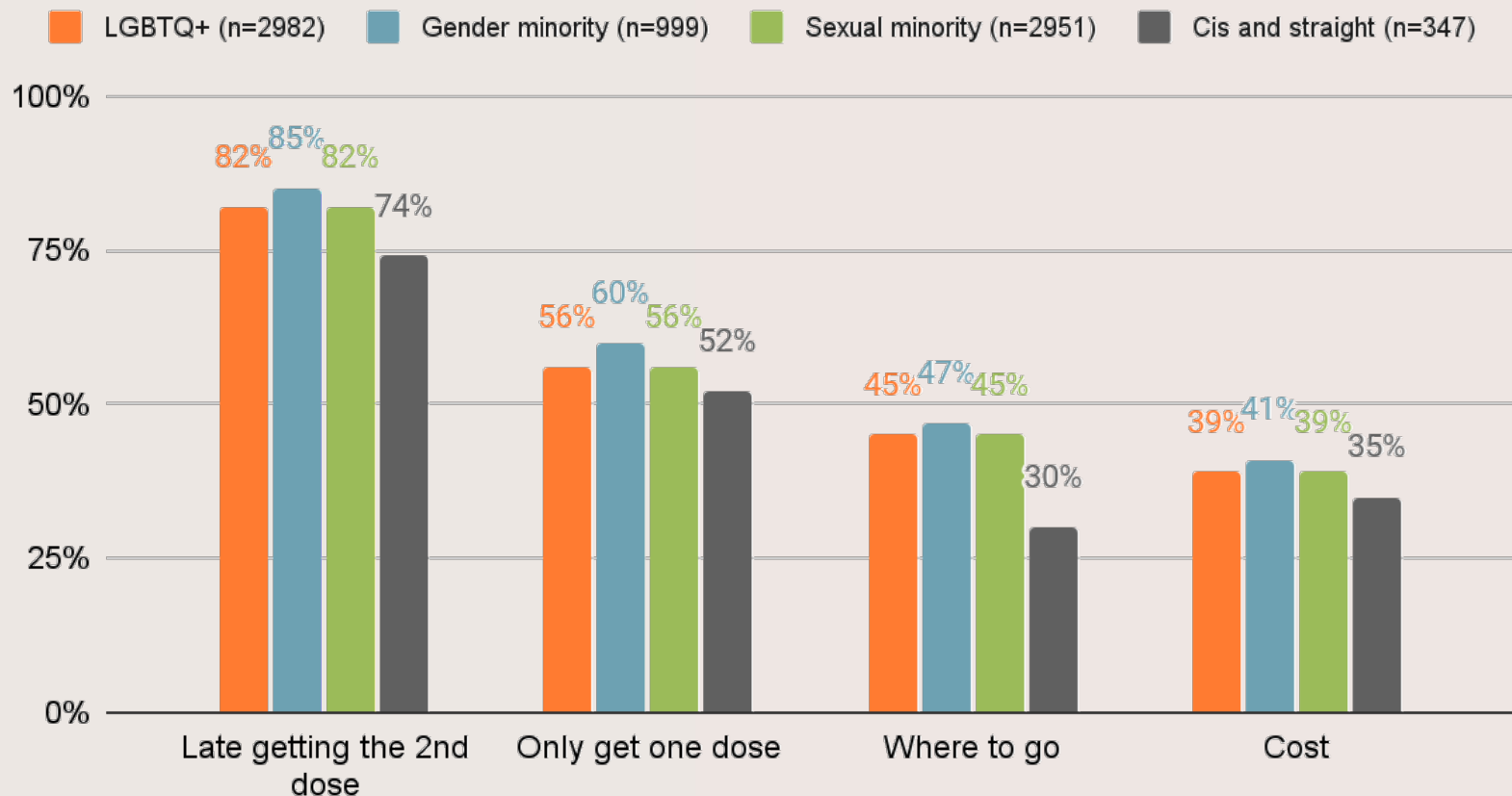
Previous bad experiences with the health system: important among sexual and gender minority people

Why will you wait to get vaccinated?



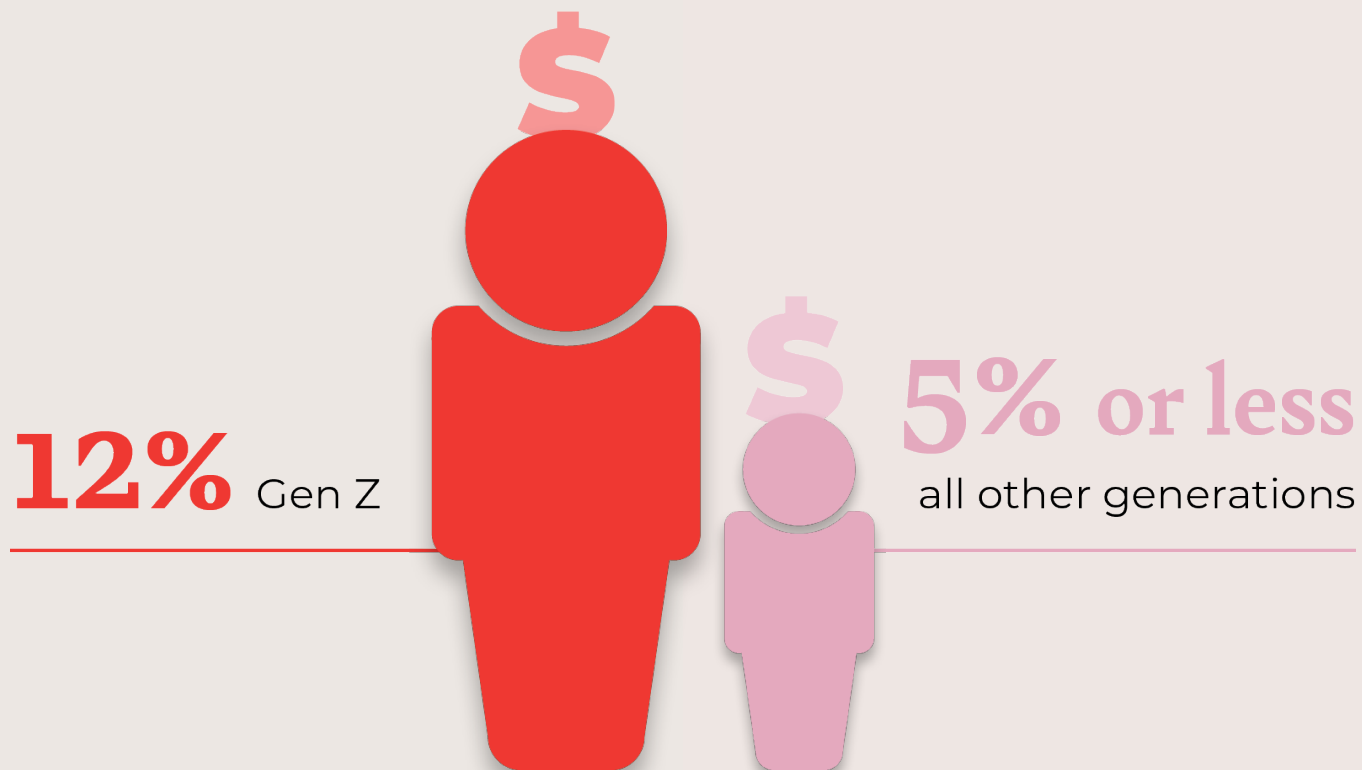
Multiple aspects of COVID-19 vaccination remain unclear to all groups
