









Dimensions of women's empowerment have different trajectories

- Empowerment is multi-dimensional
 - Inadequate SDG measures
- Policies need be multi-faceted
 - Long history (Folbre, Goldin, Sen)

Seven primary drivers of women's economic empowerment




Regional differences significant, persistent, not well understood

Policy areas

- Women entrepreneurs' training, mentoring: much known, but limited growth potential
- School-to-work transitions
- Policies that shape opportunities: progress legal frameworks, examples procurement policy
- Unpaid care: growing evidence it can work, broad impacts, affordability key question
- Broader policies: job creation & social protection, era of adjustment?
- Emerging and sometimes missing areas: social norms and women organisations
