Emily Brunson

Emily Brunson is a medical anthropologist. She received an MPH in epidemiology and a PhD in anthropology from the University of Washington. Currently Dr. Brunson an Associate Professor in the Department of Anthropology at Texas State University. Her primary research focus is health care access and decision-making, and particularly how policies, social structures (including class and racial inequalities), social networks and personal experience combine to produce health outcomes for individuals. Currently, Dr. Brunson is co-leading CommuniVax, a national coalition to strengthen the role and involvement of local Black, Indigenous and Latinx communities in an equitable COVID-19 vaccination campaign. She is also actively engaged in research on COVID-19 vaccination among college students and in efforts promoting minority students' opportunities for research experiences and professional training.
