












Preventing worker illness, injury, and death by bringing justice to the workplace.

Outdoor Heat ~ The Maria Isabel Vasquez Jimenez Heat Illness Standard


- Maria Isabel Vasquez Jimenez
 - Maria was 17-year-old and pregnant in 2008. She was pruning grapes at Merced Farm. She worked for 9 hours in 100 degree heat. Her core temperature had reached 108. She collapsed in the vineyard and died of heat stroke two days later.
- Signed into law in 2006: Prompted by the loss of 13 workers in 2005 to heat stress.
- California Rural Legal Assistance (CRLA) served as an advocate to identify outdoor heat issues directly with Cal OSHA.






California as a Model State

- First in the country; applies to all outdoor places of employment and focuses on providing workers with shade, water, acclimatization and training
- Industries covered include:
 - O Agriculture
 - Construction
 - o Landscaping
 - Oil and Gas Extraction
 - Transportation or delivery of agricultural, construction materials or other heavy materials

Examples of Industries Affected

- In 2015, environmental heat exposure contributed to 37 work-related deaths and 2,830 nonfatal occupational injuries nationally
- Restaurants & Kitchens, Office Buildings with no AC, Warehouses, Industrial Laundries, Factories, Bakeries, Electrical Utilities (i.e.

Boiler Rooms), etc.

 Still fighting for the standard to apply to all worksites where the temp ≥ 82°F








Solidarity is the KEY
