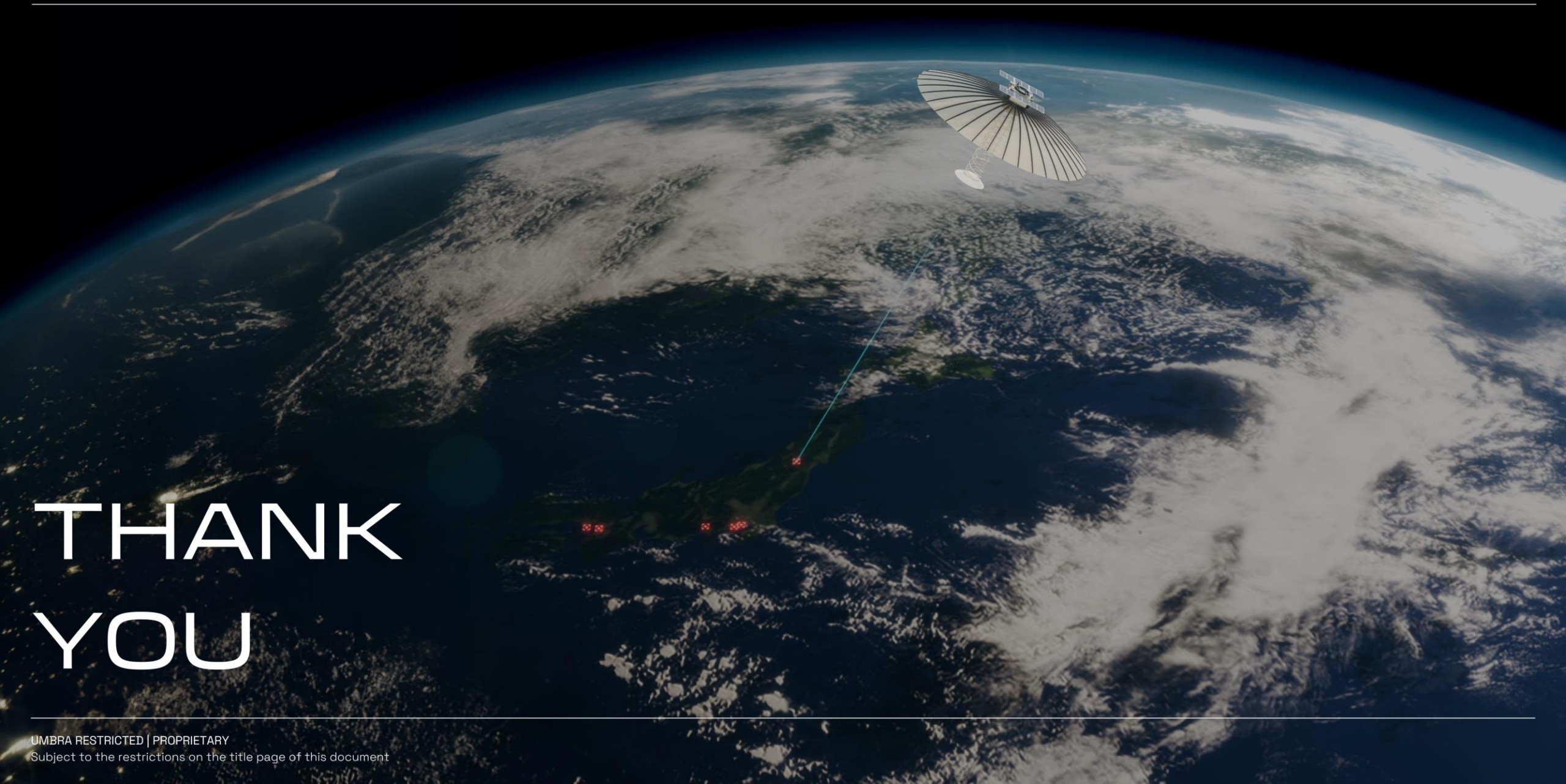
California Gov. Gavin Newsom called for an increase of \$2.5 billion in state funding for emergency response efforts and recovery in Los Angeles on January 13.
