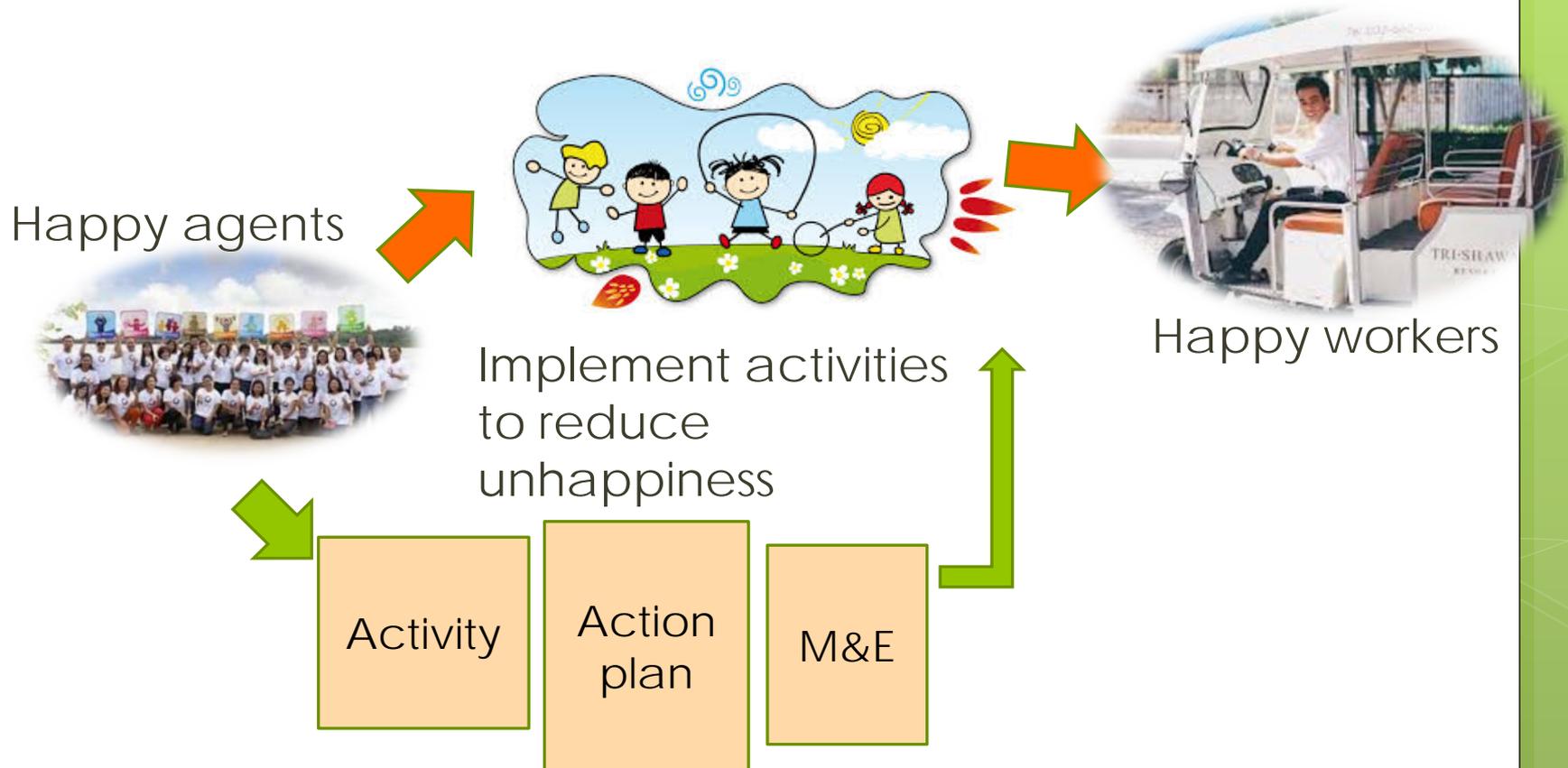

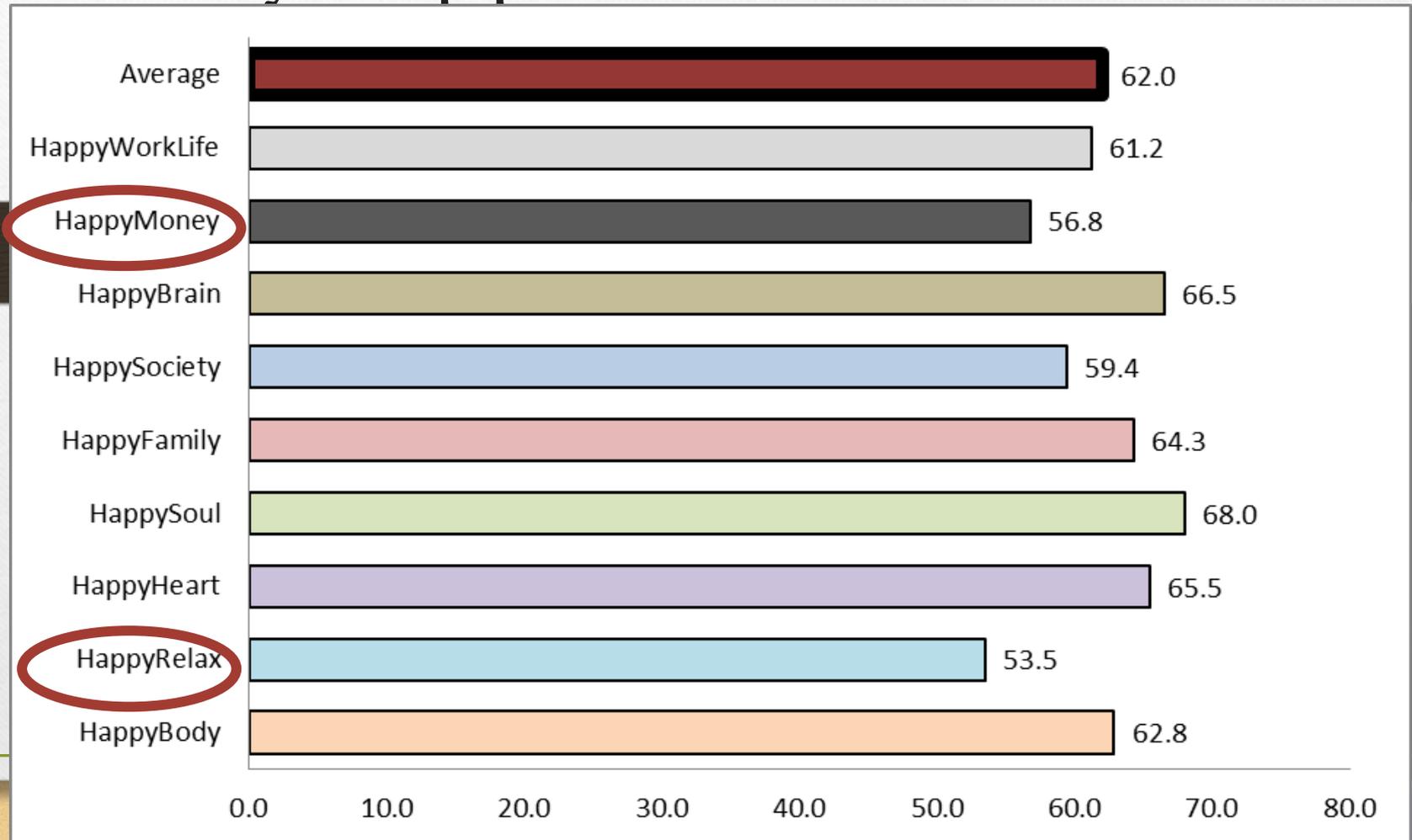

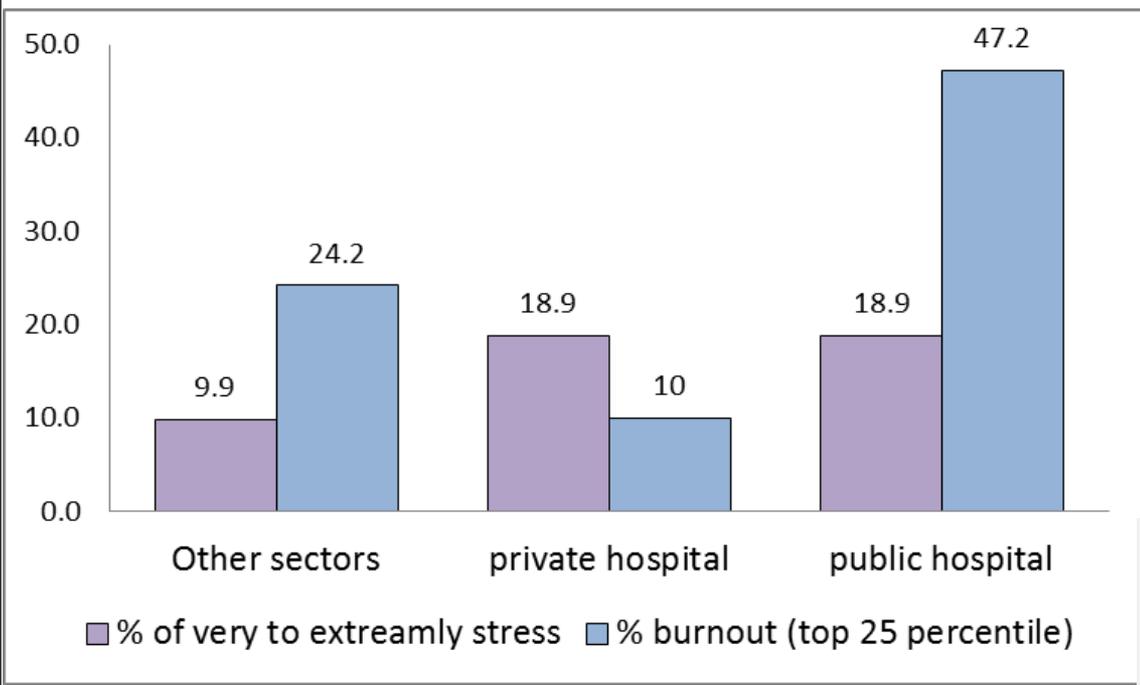

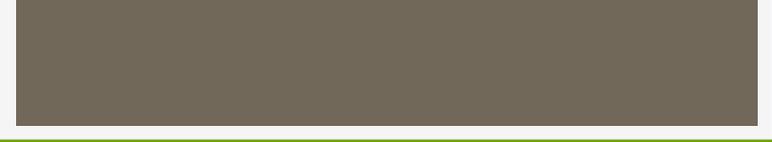

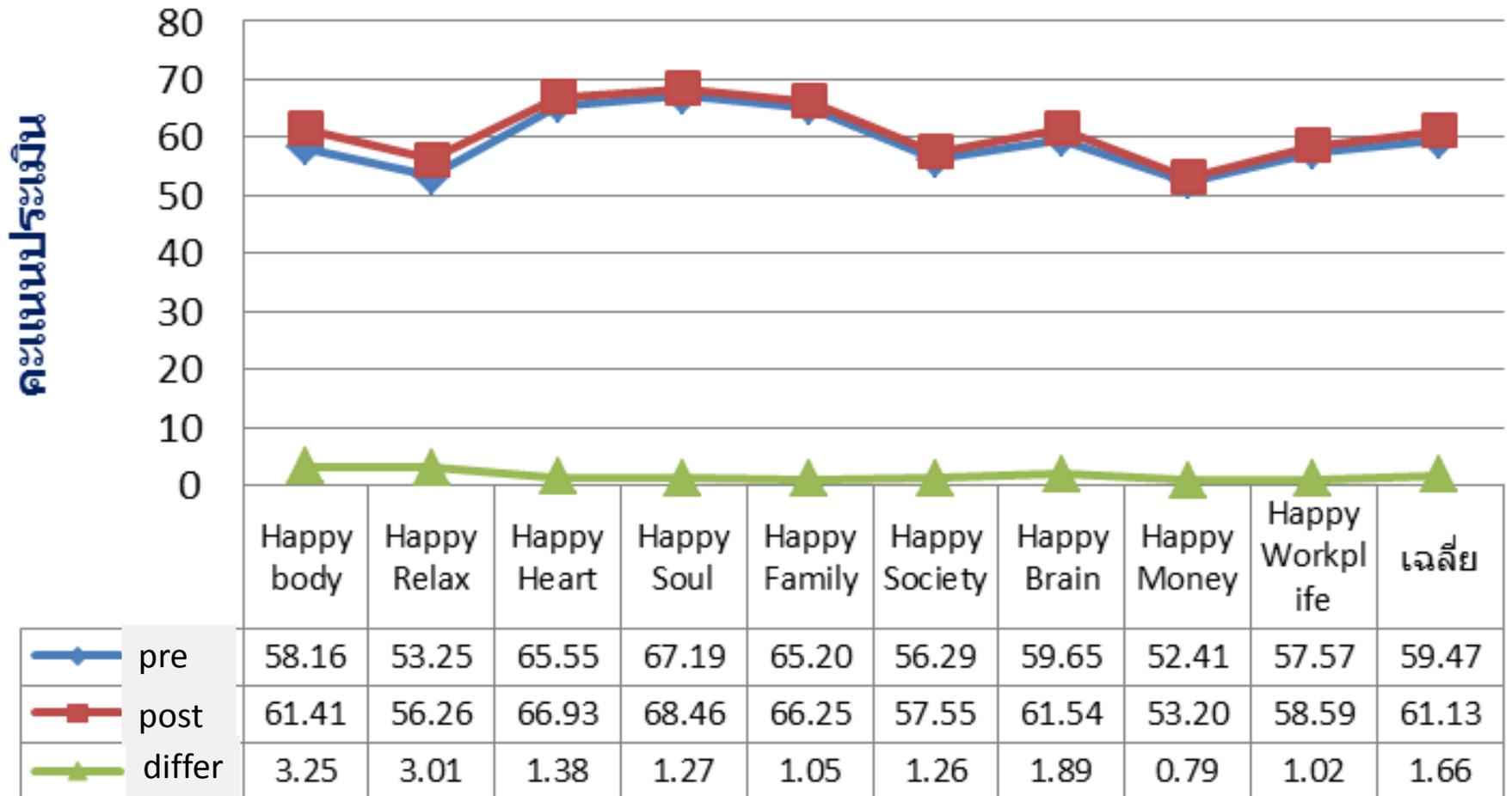

Happiness scores [pre and post happiness activities]

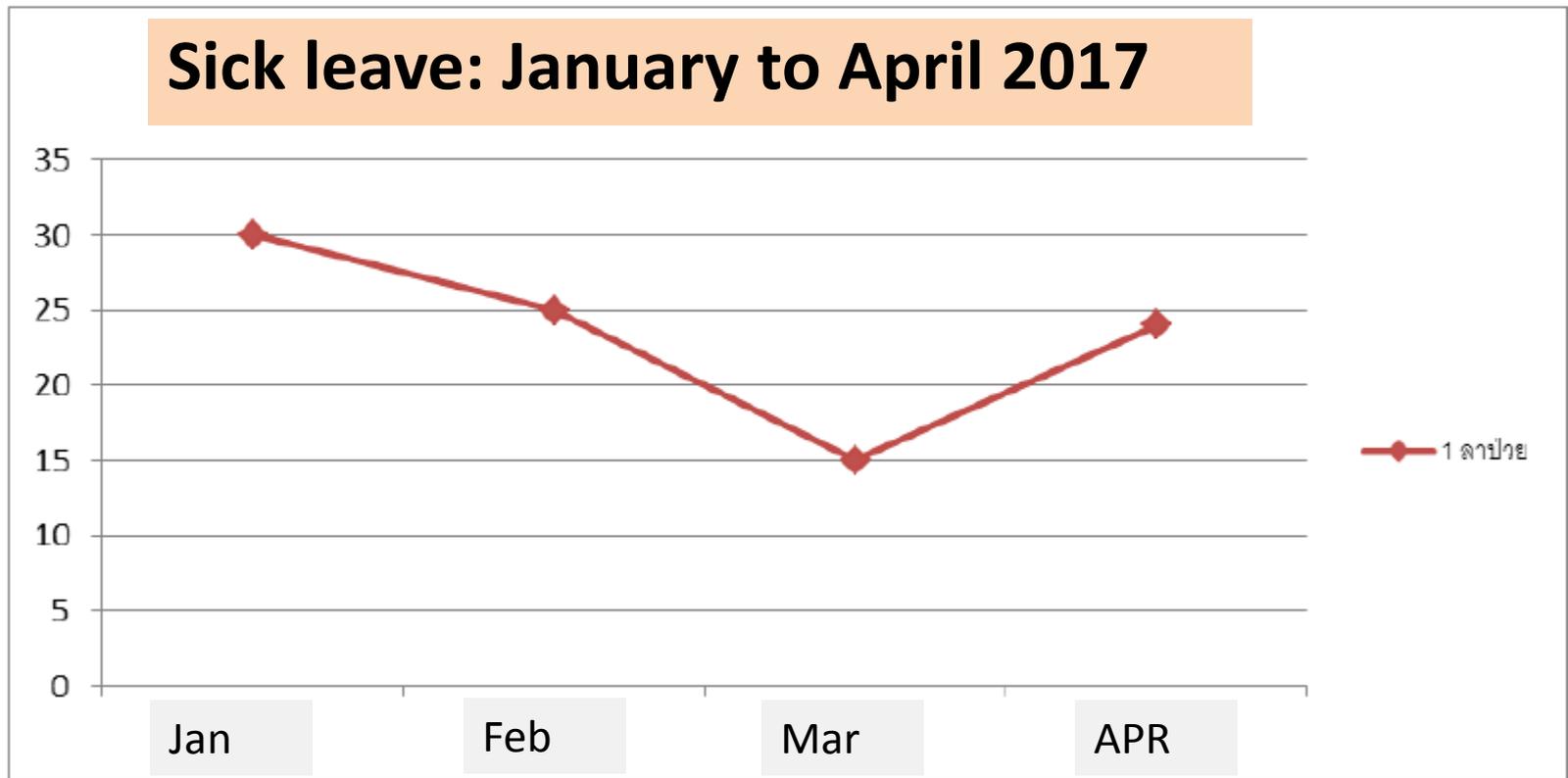

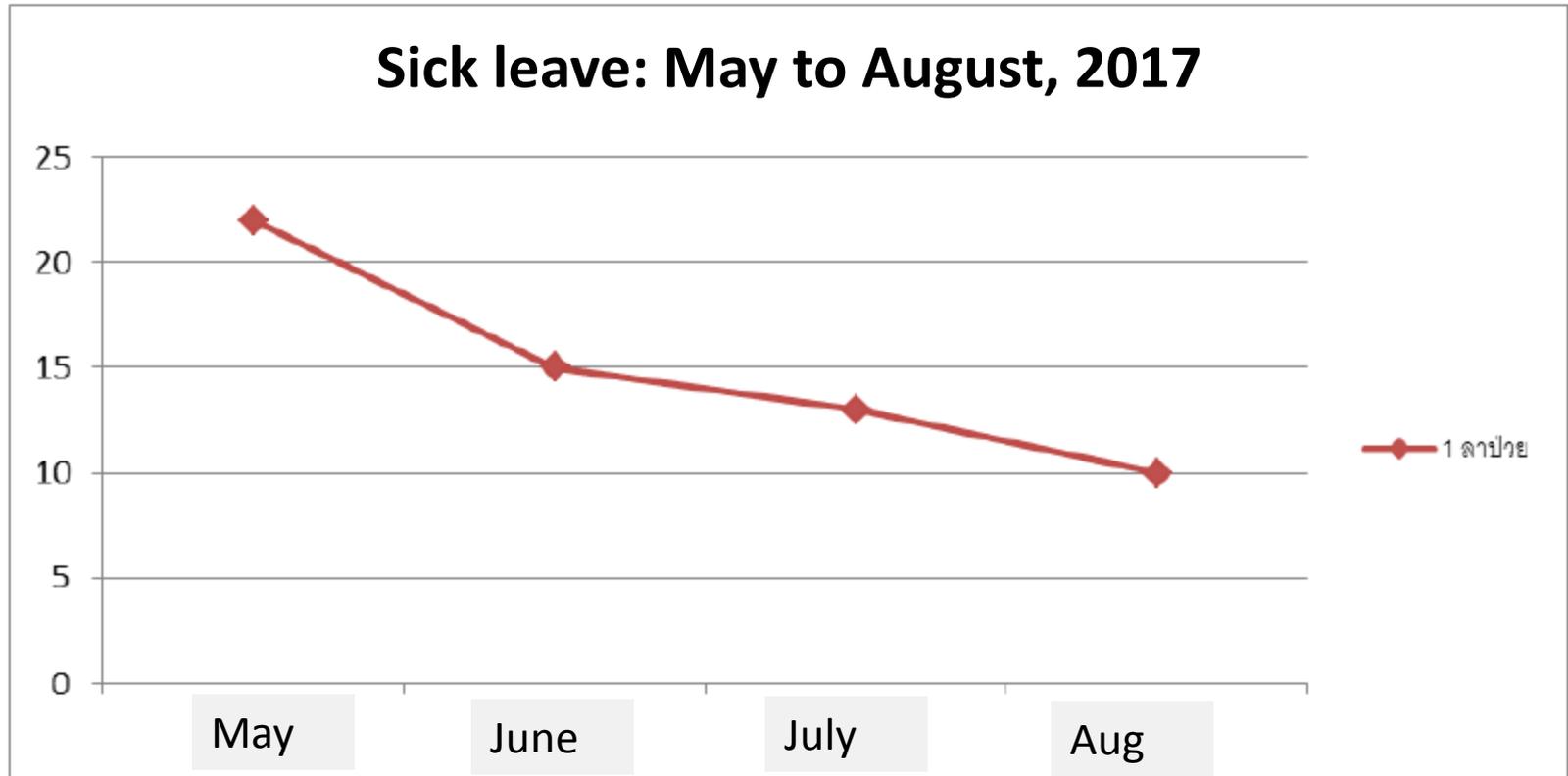


Number of Sick leave declines.



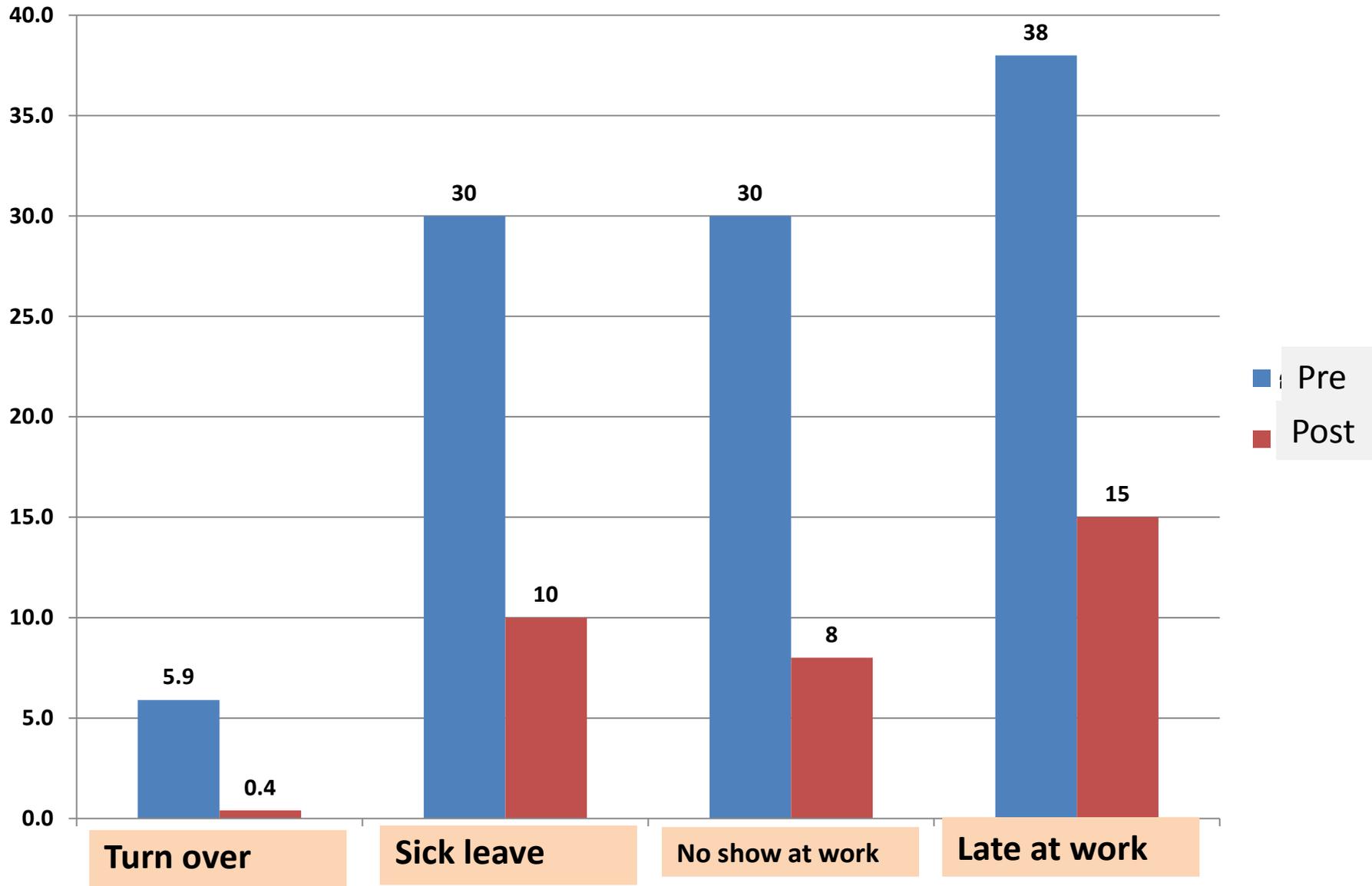

Comparing sick leave and being late at work (Before and After)

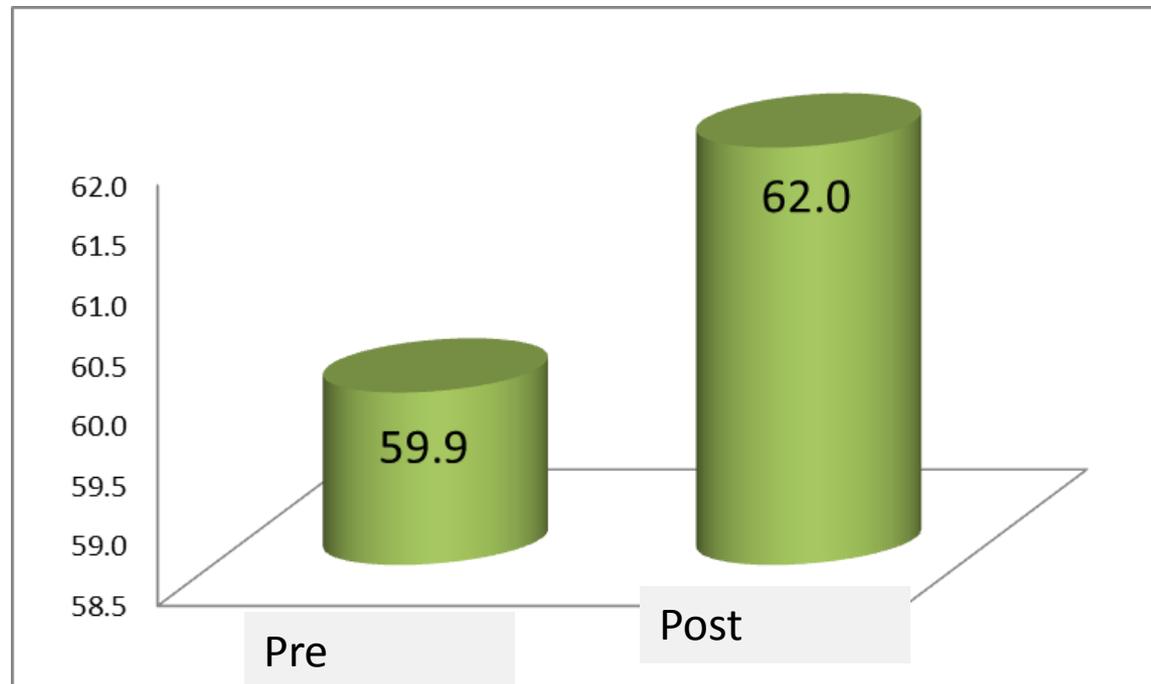

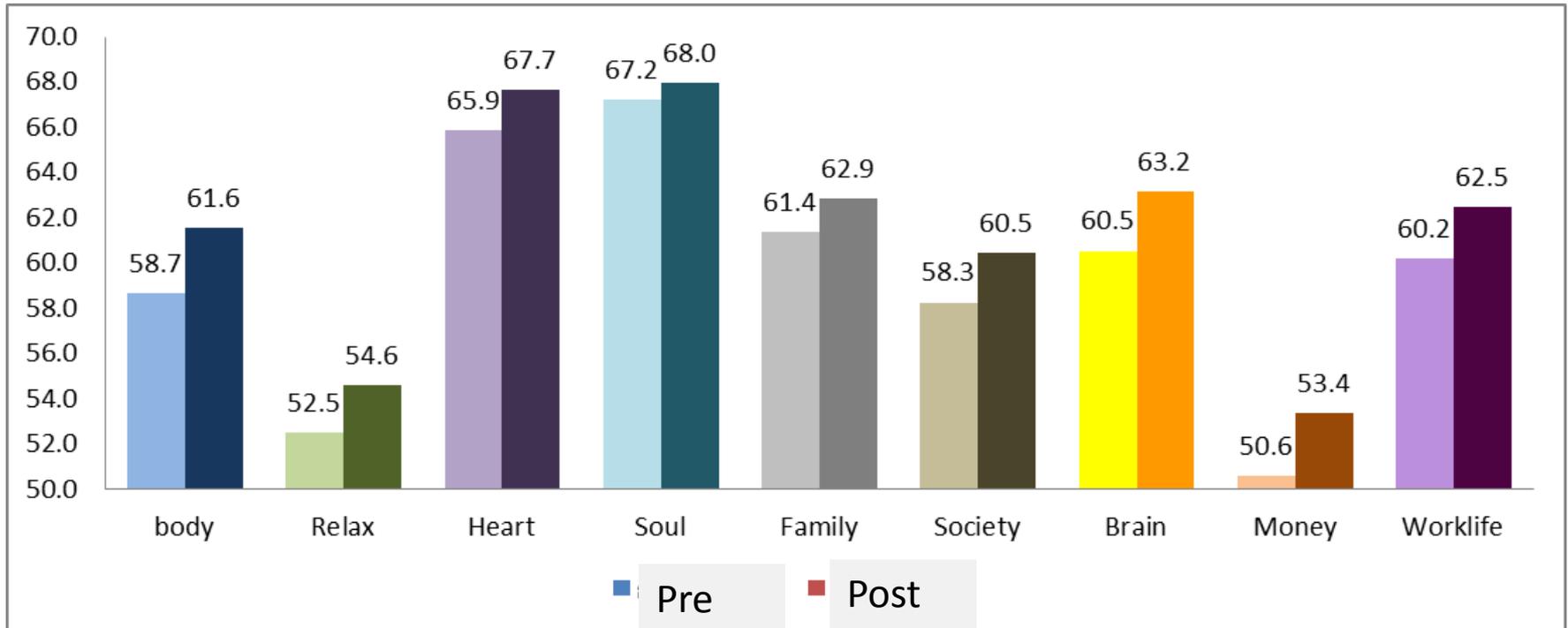
Pre and Post: Happiness scores
