

Percent of Children Immunized by BC Health Region Age 2 years - Up-to-date for age, 2018



- -3 importations of measles in unvaccinated siblings with travel to SE Asia
- -Transmission within schools and households for an additional 10 confirmed cases -Province-wide MMR catch-up campaign and introduction of Vaccination Status Reporting Regulation
- -Intense and prolonged media attention demand for information policy change
