Informal learning (away from classroom/formal) vs incidental learning (unplanned/unexpected)

Top-Level Examples in Faculty Development/ Continuing Professional Development – Academic and Clinician Educators

INFORMAL: <u>SELF-DIRECTED</u> READING ARTICLES, WATCHING WEBINARS, OBSERVING OTHER FACULTY, TWEET CHATS, MENTORING

INCIDENTAL: <u>UNEXPECTED</u>
WATCHING TV, REVIEWING SOCIAL
MEDIA POSTS, OBSERVING OTHER
INDUSTRIES OR PROFESSIONS

Lessons From My Own Life!

Informal

- As a student, listening to other members of the interprofessional team (in the 1980s!)
- Listening to mentors
- Talking with colleagues
- Watching others at all levels and in all locations

Incidental

- Stand-up comedy
- Representing diversity
- Talking with another passenger on a plane

A Framework Exists

CONTEXT Interpret Frame the context Triggers experience CONTEXT Examine **Evaluate Lessons** alternative WORK Learned solutions Assess intended Produce the Choose learning proposed and unintended strategies solutions consequences **CONTEXT**
