






# Harris County: Big, Diverse & Complex

# HCPH and the Case for "One Health"

In one year in Harris County, diseases that spread from animals to people ...



### Salmonella and E.coli cases

Due to eating or handling contaminated animal products



95

West Nile Virus, chikungunya, and malaria cases All transmitted by mosquitoes



### Cryptosporidium or "crypto" cases

A parasite spread by food, water, or soil contaminated by sick animals

\*Numbers represent closed cases of illness in humans in unincorporated Harris County (excluding Houston) in 2014.3

### After One Health

Disease investigators tell mosquito control about the West Nile Virus case




Connected approach = Cause of disease eliminated

Animal control reports the location of the dumped tires to mosquito control




















With the purpose of providing our community with an efficient fair, and equitable distribution process, Harris County Public Health (HCPH) has created a vaccine "smart" waitlist. 


