Welcome to Africa One Health University Network (AFROHUN), formerly One Health Central and Eastern Africa (OHCEA).



#### **RWANDA**

The country has obtained robots that will be used by Ministry of Health and especially (but not limited to) COVID-19 quarantine centers. These robots will be used to monitor patients' temperatures, distribute medicine, food and other supplies in order to reduce as much as possible direct contact between patients and health attendants.

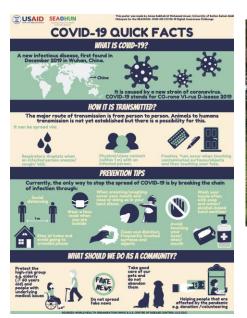

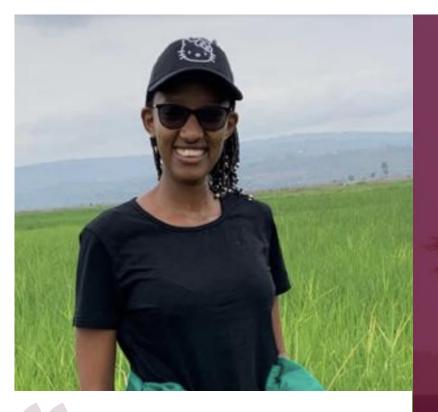
## ONEHEMPION

Rwanda is adopting a new strategic plan envisioning to promote and strengthen interdisciplinary collaboration and partnerships in a One Health approach and strengthen surveillance, early detection, rapid response, prevention and control of zoonoses, antimicrobial resistance and other public health threats. Furthermore, the One Health Strategic plan will build capacity and promote applied research at the human-animal-ecosystem interface."
