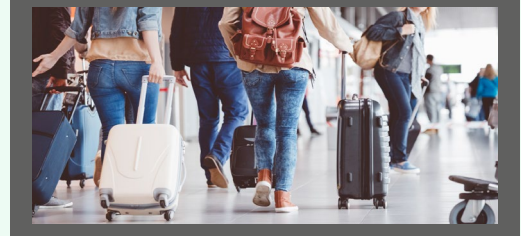


Report Release Webinar: Improving the CDC Quarantine Station Network's Response to Emerging Threats
