Dr. Cathy Baase



Dr. Baase serves as the Board Chairperson of the Michigan Health Improvement Alliance (MIHIA), a multi-stakeholder collaborative dedicated to improving the health of people in 14 counties of central Michigan. In a related role, she is the Senior Fellow serving MIHIA and the transformational initiative THRIVE (Transforming Health Regionally in a Vibrant Economy). She is a member of the Roundtable on Population Health Improvement of the National Academy of Sciences, Engineering and Medicine and served as the initial chair of the Business Collaborative. Catherine Baase retired from her role as Chief Health Officer and Global Director of Health Services for The Dow Chemical Company, a position she held for 20 years of her 32 years with Dow.

She is a Fellow in the American College of Occupational and Environmental Medicine and a Fellow in the American Academy of Family Physicians.

Rebecca Bentley



Rebecca Bentley is Vice President of Global Public Affairs for Dow, a global materials science company with \$43 billion in annual revenues and 36,500 employees located at more than 100 sites across 31 countries. Rebecca leads Dow's Public Affairs team worldwide, and manages a broad span of governance and enterprise-level issues for the company, including executive and employee communications, media relations and financial communications, corporate governance and M&A activities, as well as geographic, business and marketing communications. She provides counsel for Dow's CEO, President and CFO, and is a member of the Company's Operations Team, which is accountable for operational controls of the Company, including the productivity and performance of Dow's business, functional and regional operations.
