Voting & Health in CO

- Inclusive voting policies, including:
 - Automatic voter registration through the DMV,
 - Same-day and election day registration,
 - No-excuse absentee voting, and
 - Restoration of rights for ex-felons
- 71% of eligible voters are registered

- Pre-pandemic uninsured rate 6.5%
- Medicaid expansion state
- Rate relatively well on health indicators

So why are we excited about Medicaid AVR?


- 29% of eligible voters aren't registered
- 20% of the state population, 1.3 million people, are covered through Medicaid
- Voter registration status/stability shares similar challenges to Medicaid coverage

Medicaid AVR

- Builds on robust health enrollment efforts, infrastructure (CO caveat), networks
- Medicaid AVR creates a foundation that can help us reach up to 95% voter registration
 - That could mean an additional 385,528 voters
 - 90% are voters of color and/or under age 30
- Close equity gaps in registration

Voting is a form of consumer voice that supports health

- Correlation between voting and better health outcomes
 - Lower uninsured
 - Better reported health
 - Lower infant mortality

We work to raise and amplify consumer voices for better health care, and improving voting access is a fundamental way to do that!
