



Total = 13.9 million children with special health care needs





### Section 1115 Demonstrations: What are They?

- Named after Section 1115 of the Social Security Act
- Allows the Secretary of Health and Human Services to grant waivers of certain requirements in Medicaid, CHIP, or spend/receive federal in different ways
- Waivers must be necessary to conduct a true health coverage demonstration, experiment, or pilot project and promote the objectives of Medicaid

### **How Long do Waivers Last?**

- Only "for the period ... necessary" to carry out experiment
- Initial approval period is usually five years
- Renewal/Extension typically three years
  - Short term extensions are often granted while agreements are being negotiated
- Trump-era CMS authorized longer (10 year) extensions



## Section 1115 Demos: How Much Flexibility is There?

 HHS can't waive everything – only certain parts of the law. HHS can't waive or change the match rates



 Demonstrations must be "budget neutral" for the federal government; but this is not a statutory requirement


