You can serve as a general reviewer or a technical reviewer. The general reviewer answers 3 basic questions for each policy they select and the technical reviewer answers 13 for each policy. If you feel you have special knowledge about any policies, you may want to consider doing the technical review survey which includes questions about evidence base, implementation and more. You are welcome to participate in both the technical and general review of the policy database.

While there are over 130 policies in the database, you do not need to review all of the policies to participate. You can choose as few or as many policies to review depending on your available time and area(s) of expertise.

General Review

General reviewers will rate selected policies based on three, likert-scale [questions](#) related to the importance and feasibility of the policy.

Technical Review

Technical reviewers will complete a series of 13 [questions](#) about the selected policy, including its evidence base, implementation, costs, reliability, and sustainability.

Policy Review Process

In order to review a policy, we recommend the following:

- Visit the [Equitable Economies Policy Database](#) and review the 11 impact area topics.
- Identify the policies within each impact area you would like to review.
- Rate each selected policy via SurveyMonkey (links provided above).

- Participate in a brief demographic survey via SurveyMonkey.

We anticipate that the review will take about one hour of your time, depending on how many policies you choose to review in each impact area. Participant reviewers will not be asked to endorse any of the policies, though you will be acknowledged for your participation.

We recognize that there are an abundance of ways that we can make our economy more equitable. Through the WIN Network we have the opportunity to lift up areas of influence that advance intergenerational health and well-being, and we want to make sure your perspective is included.
