National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine (NASEM). 2021. [Rental Eviction and the COVID-19 Pandemic: Averting a Looming Crisis](#). Washington, DC: National Academies Press.

The report proposes a range of strategies and actions for the full range of actors and stakeholders to implement over the next 3 years in order to:

- **Mitigate:** bridge financial, social, and legal assistance
- **Inform:** improve the collection of data and the use of information to support affected communities and inform policy makers
- **Assist:** make affordable housing fair and accessible
- **Secure:** preserve, provide, and expand safe affordable housing

NASEM. 2019. [Vibrant Healthy Kids: Aligning, Science, Practice, and Policy to Advance Health Equity](#). Washington, DC: National Academies Press.

The report identifies four categories of fundamental needs, including safe and stable housing, that are crucial to address in order to further health equity for children.

NASEM. 2019. [Integrating Social Care into the Delivery of Health Care: Moving Upstream to Improve the Nation's Health](#). Washington, DC: National Academies Press.

The report discusses and makes recommendations about social spending with health effects, e.g., Medicaid waivers to support social care, such as housing, and community-level data sharing, including on housing.

The report includes extensive discussion of housing as a social determinant of health and recommends that relevant government agencies “Prioritize affordable housing, implement strategies to mitigate and avoid displacement (and its serious health effects), and document outcomes.”
