



Specific Research Interests

- Minor cannabinoids and terpenes as analgesics.
- Clinical research to support translational studies of cannabinoids and terpenes:
 - Symptom management of sleep disturbance
 - Pain conditions
 - Mental health conditions managed in primary care

 - With NCI, NEI, NIA, NIAAA, NIDCR, NIDA, NINDS, ODS, ORWH




