










Black Fatigue





Stroke

Black people are 44% more likely to die from a stroke

HIV/AIDS

Black women represent more than 66% of new HIV/AIDS cases

High Blood Pressure

Black men are 30% more likely and Black women are 60% more likely to be diagnosed with high blood pressure

<u>Cancer</u>

Black women are 52% more likely to die from cervical cancer and 40% more likely to die from breast cancer than white women

Birth

Black women are 243% more likely than white women to die from pregnancy or child-birth-related causes

Heart Disease

Black people are 25% more likely to die from heart disease

Violence is linked to equity



Black youth account for 38% of all gun homicide fatalities in 2020 even though they represent only 2% of the total population in the U.S.








Education and health outcomes
