### KEY FINDINGS

- Measure neighborhood access from actual park entrances.
- Entire neighborhoods are not accessible if not walkable
- Access is more than ADA
- Some results will surprise

- Begin at a local school with a supportive principal (not the superintendent)
- Signage is important for clarity to the surrounding community
- Private sector funding for open use can make it more palatable to schools



# LYNX BLUE LINE EXTENSION HEALTH IMPACT ASSESSMENT























# LYNX SYSTEM EXPANSION HEALTH INDICATORS
