- 2) Nurture existing and develop new partnerships to <u>develop an active information dissemination network</u>.
- 3) Partner with vulnerable communities disseminate culturally and linguistically appropriate information.
- 4) Link target communities to COVID-19 healthcare and social services
- 5) Monitor, evaluate and measure outcomes using process improvement methods for successful implementation.
- 6) Use comprehensive dissemination scientific methods and strategies to bring awareness, participation, education and training.

Can download full or customized data sets




Can download localized resource listings




