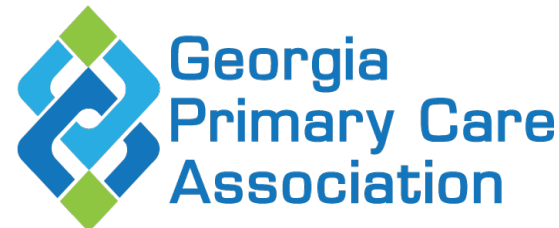

- 3) Partner with vulnerable communities disseminate culturally and linguistically appropriate information.
- 4) Link target communities to COVID-19 healthcare and social services
- 5) Monitor, evaluate and measure outcomes using process improvement methods for successful implementation.
- 6) Use comprehensive dissemination scientific methods and strategies to bring awareness, participation, education and training.

Approximately 600 signals/variables available as well as index measures



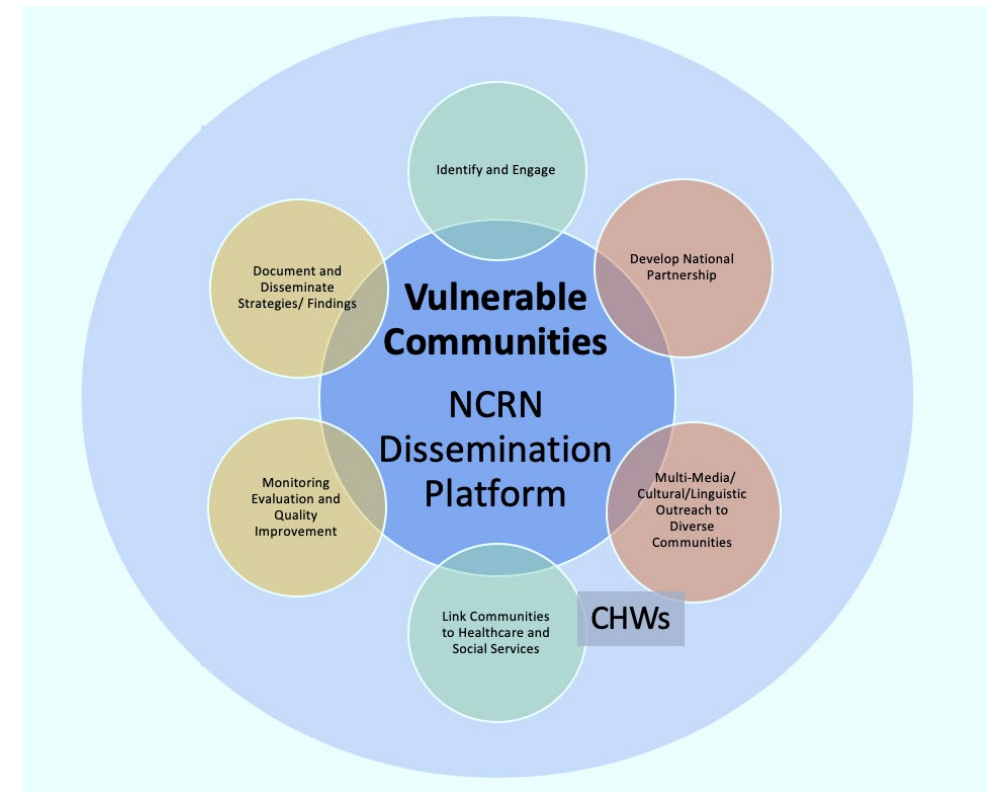
Comparison of places with high concentration of priority populations compared to the entire US



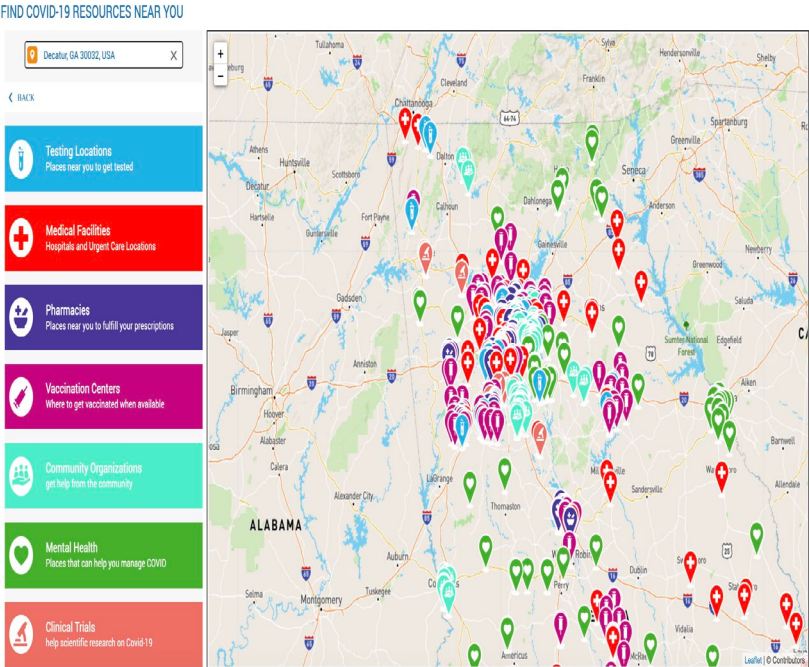

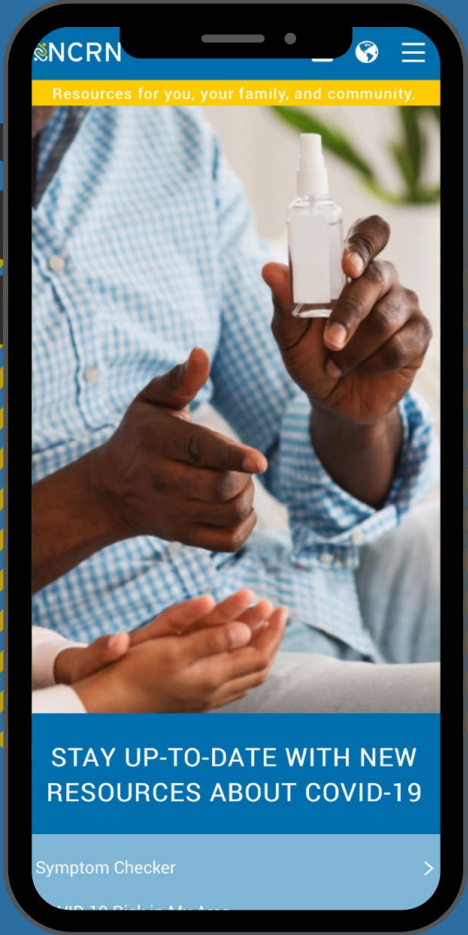

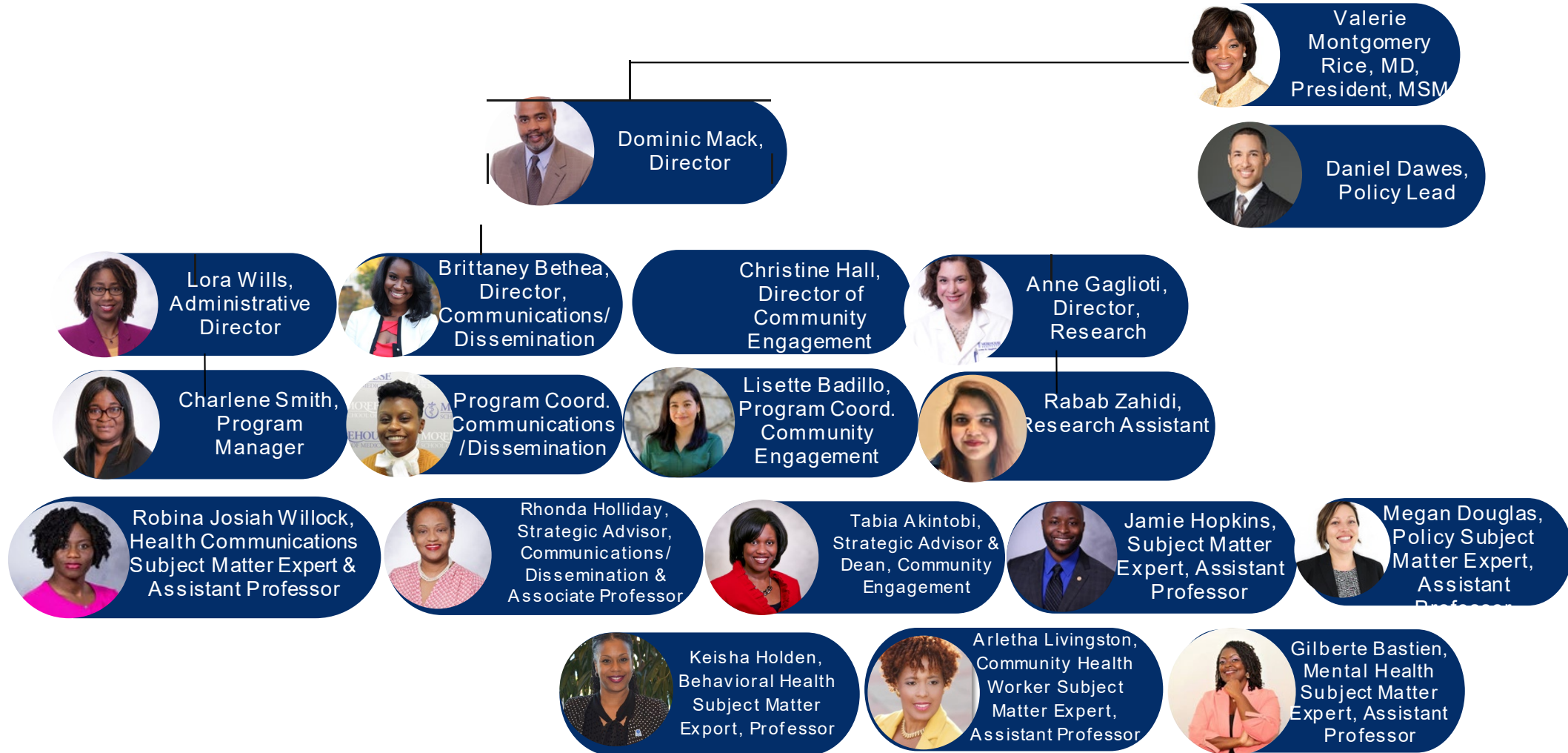
