
#### Primary care in 2019

- > 50% of all ambulatory visits
- < 35% of the workforce</li>
- ~7% of national health expenditure
- 0.4% of NIH funding
- 99% of visits related to upper respiratory, lower respiratory and pneumonia



# QuickCOVID-19 Survey for Clinicians

Weekly, then monthly, March 13, 2020 to the present 36 surveys fielded. Over 35,000 responses collected





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#### Primary care in 2022

- 22% of practices are fully staffed
- 62% know clinicians who have retired/quit early
- 29% know of practices that have closed
- 40% are receiving patients from closed practices
- 46% say US primary care is crumbling
- 67% endorse the statement "We are clinically fragile - when is someone going to notice."



### Measures are about comparison and context

Measure – just a number, meaningless without context Quality – standard based on comparison and expectation Performance – how well a task is done Accountability – actions aligned with quality and norms

- Measure guidance: <u>Chapter 8, NASEM report</u>
- Measurement approach: <u>Virginia Task Force on Primary Care</u>
