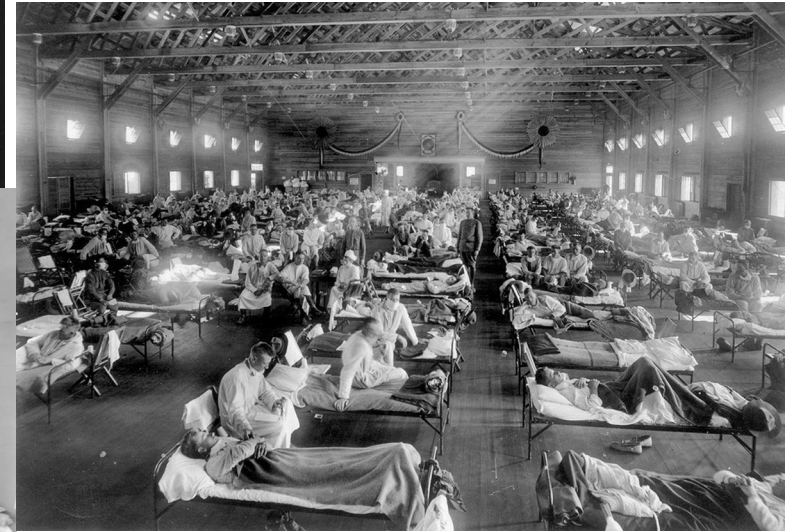


W. E. B. Du Bois

- The Philadelphia Negro
 - Sociological study of African Americans in Philadelphia written by W. E. B. Du Bois
 - Commissioned by the University of Pennsylvania and published in 1899 with the intent of identifying social problems present in the African American community
- Foundational work in the field of urban sociology
- Exhaustive study of one population
- Sensitive portrait of a population responding actively to social stresses and to the demands of urban life, rather than seeing them either as passive victims or social cancer
- Findings: A community of diversity and advancement, yet a simultaneous reaffirmation of the reality of poverty, crime, and illiteracy

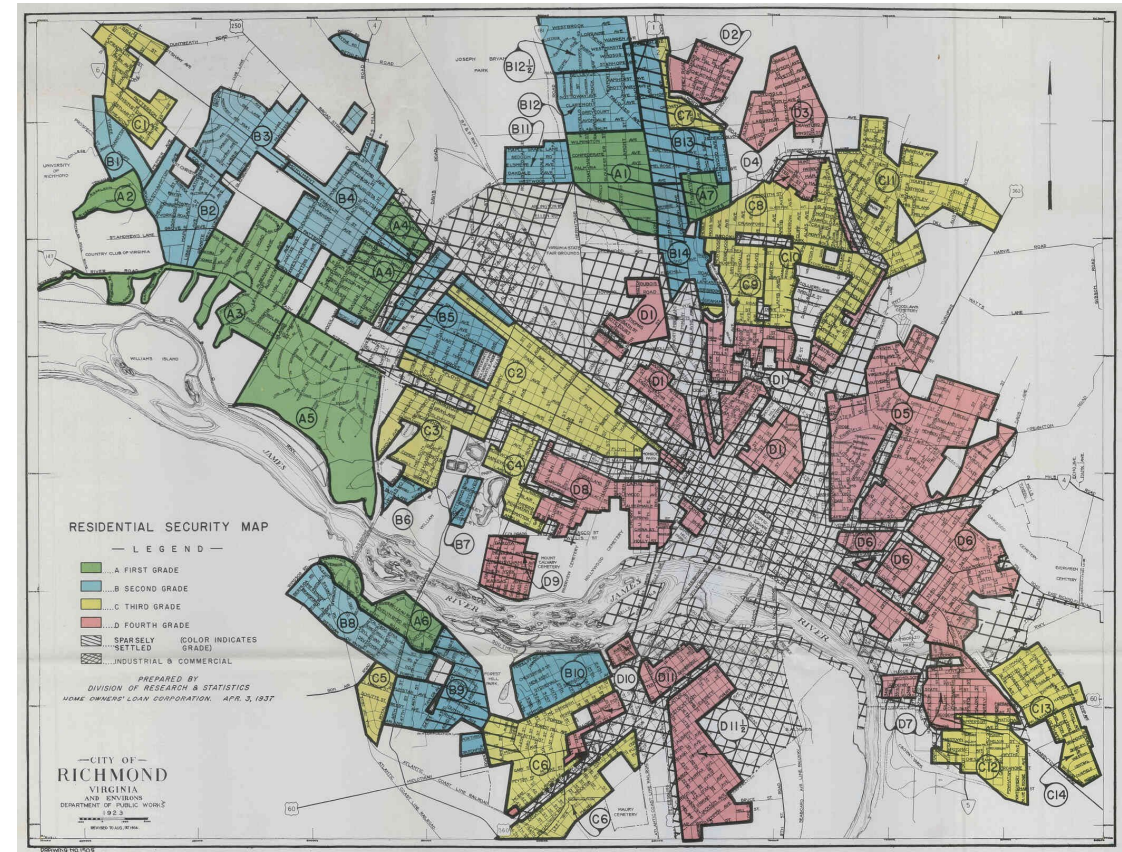

 - B – Blue “developed”
 - C – Yellow “aged”
 - D – Red “undesirable population”

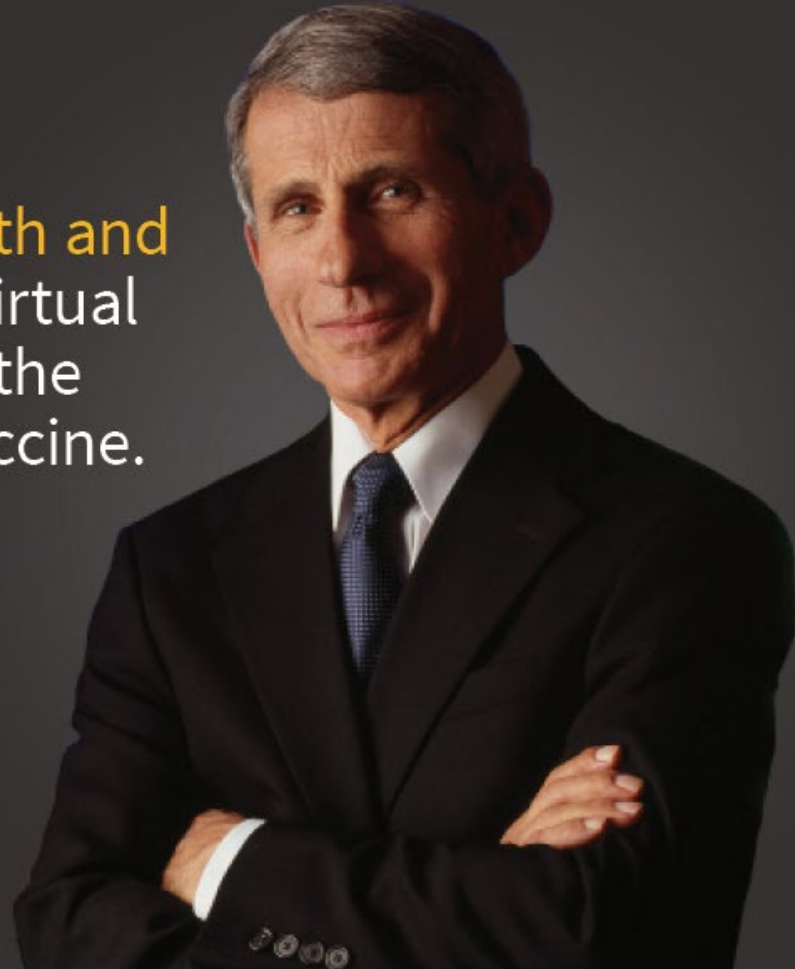
