- CHW Definition foundation for all policy
- Core Competencies recognized body of knowledge
- CHW Association led by CHWs (MACHW)
- State CHW Infrastructure Office of CHWs at MA DPH
- Voluntary Certification grounded in core competencies
- Workforce Surveillance track workforce, impacts of certification, training needs and financing trends
- Code of Ethics established by MACHW; part of certification
- Scope of Practice established in regulation by Board of Certification
- Financing resources for workforce infrastructure and salaries

- Barriers may include access to federal programs and procurement/contracting opportunities
- New policies, regulations, or guidance documents may be needed to advance equity
- Institutional resources for advancing civil rights and serving underrepresented communities must be evaluated






- Strengthens agency community partnerships and engagement
