




2 enforced breaks in program



so how do you get a hand transplant


- Physically suitable
- Psychologically suitable
- Immunologically suitable
- Over 18 years age (at present)



Hierarchy of needs within a recipient

- Limb loss or functionless limb
- Exhausted prosthetic options
- Has sufficient capacity to make decision

Satisfies screening criteria



hypothesis: two avoidable reasons for rejection

- Immunological
- Behavioural: the first case current era and its failure

Standard immunological serial assessment

- Takes place repeatedly over a year
- Identifies fluctuating HLA antibodies
- Allows virtual crossmatch at time of offer

Psychology plays a most important role

- In Leeds, all potential hand transplant patients undergo extensive psychological assessment to assess their psychological suitability for transplantation and to establish their expectations from transplant
- It provides a detailed understanding of their life, their request for surgery, and their personal characteristics.
- It also facilitates the informed complex decision-making required of them, whereby they weigh up the risks and benefits of hand transplant, specifically applied to them
- Screens for absolute contraindications

Psychology assessment

- Stepped approach
- Semi-structured interview
- Psychometric assessment / data collection
- Provision of written information prior to the appointment (includes a section on psychological risks).

Characteristics sought in recipient

Cognitive capacity to undertake decision-making and informed consent

Ability to cope process and adjust

- Stability, reliability and compliance demonstrated over time
- Communicate realistic tolerance and clear expectations of physical outcome

Physical characteristics to consider

- Size
- Age
- Gender
- Skin tone
- Tattoos
- Scars

Psychology in addition....

- provides detailed information to enable consent
- test retention over time to validate consent

The Year of Waiting

- From acceptance to program
- 12 months minimum

- 4X Psych assessments and contacts
- 4X Immunology assessment
