

# **Braided/Aligned Funding Approaches**

#### Aligning Insurance Coverage with Grants

- Alaska's Behavioral Health Aide (<u>Indian Health Service \$ + Medicaid SPA</u>)
- SAMHSA, HRSA, HUD, DOE, USDA grants +

#### New opportunities in Medicare

IBH; Expanded provider types; Community Health Integration/Principal Navigation

#### Opioid Settlements

Direct investments and loan repayment (IN, MA, MI, ND, RI, TN)

#### Philanthropic Investments

Capacity building, short-term infrastructure, pay-for-performance, research




# Advancing team-based, evidence-based models in community; matched to needs

- Optimizing team composition and reducing burden
  - Collaborative Care Model (CoCM)
  - CCBHCs, CMHCS & FQHCs
  - School-based and Systems of Care for children and youth
  - Coordinated Specialty Care
- Strategically incorporating lived experience
  - peer & recovery support specialists
    - 48 state reimburse in Medicaid (38 for mental health and substance use)
    - Georgia's approach across the care continuum
  - Community based workforce: Community Health Workers/Promatores

# Workforce Extenders: Telehealth & Digital

#### **State Telehealth Reimbursement**: Center for Connected Health Policy

- States moving to broader adoption of permanent telehealth policies including Medicaid and private payer policies
- Addition of locations and provider types: School-based
- Audio-only reimbursement is more common (tends to include limits to conditions/services)
- About half have an explicit payment parity law
- Behavioral health is behind far various reasons including lack of investment in IT infrastructure
  - SAMHSA and ONC Behavioral health Information Technology Initiative

Artificial Intelligence (AI) – optimizing workflows; documentation supports

**Digital Therapeutics** – new terrain; slow uptake in Medicaid; employed by health plans - triaging based on need



# **Commercial Insurance and Public-Private Opportunities**

#### Parity

- Nearly half of states have some form of legislation waiting for Federal Rule
- Washington and Massachusetts examples of robust state approaches
- Triaging matching needs to resources and workforce extenders
- Capacity building for provider participation and workforce development
