Potential Solutions for Rural Doctors of Any Specialty That May Need to Treat Pregnant Patients

- 1. Make an anonymous toll-free number available for patients to call and get help making arrangements that does not involve or endanger the oncologist.
- 2. Arrange for pregnancy consultants who are available by phone to discuss the risks to the patient's cancer prognosis and her fetus' health of carrying a pregnancy to term.
- 3. Identify and establish resources for counseling and support not only for pregnant patients but the oncologists who work with them.
- 4. Support national efforts to protect abortion access by pregnant cancer patients.
- 5. Inform oncologists about legal resources such as the <u>Abortion Defense Network</u>, where clinicians and patients can be connected with free legal advice related to abortion care.
- 6. Help connect oncologists with organizations that might be able to be more proactive in protecting oncologists from prosecution and persecution.
- 7. Share resources with patients and doctors in other specialties.
