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DEA Supports Medication Assisted Treatment

DEA helps those who are harmed by drug trafficking and relentlessly pursues those who cause the harm. In this spirit, DEA is committed to doing all it can to expand access to medically assisted treatment to help those suffering from substance use disorder.

The Administration, DOJ, DEA, and HHS, among many others, are focused on efforts to improve use of MAT in order to reduce overdose deaths and help those suffering from opioid use disorder to recover.

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DEA is working within its authority to improve access to treatment options, principally to expand access to methadone (schedule II) and buprenorphine (schedule III) for medication assisted treatment.
