

Forget Me Not Reached over 30,000 in 5 years

- Sold Out Crowds of 400-1200 primarily African Americans
- 99% positive experience with the play and educational program that accompanies the performance
- Over 90% of individuals who have participated in the event express a change in their knowledge, understanding of what they can do to help prevent or mitigate the effects of the disease.
- Consistently 80% say HCP never discussed brain health with them
- 80% expressed willingness and interest in participating in clinical research and provide personal contact information which is passed on to our academic and other partners where appropriate.
