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During the year. These scores also allow us to see how well students are doing compared to other students in the nation.

What is the Scantron test? This is a computer-based test that was given to all students in grades K-5 at the beginning and end of the year. Student growth on this test tells us how much students learn during the year. These scores also allow us to see how well students are doing compared to other students in the nation. This year, schools began testing using the NWEA MAP test, which is another computer-based test, so Scantron will not be used in the future.

How does CPS decide which schools are on probation? CPS measures schools on their performance and how much students are growing academically in 2012. The school receives a rating based on the Performance Policy, which can be Level 1, 2, or 3. Level 1 is the highest rating, while Level 3 schools are placed on probation. This year the Performance Policy is based mostly on the state test (the ISAT), but next year it will be based on the NWEA MAP test. What are the Climate and Culture measures and why do they matter? A great school is more than just a school that does well on tests. Great schools provide a safe, respectful, and academically rich environment. CPS uses surveys, discipline data, attendance rates, and more to measure these things.

What is my school doing to improve? Each school has a plan, called a Continuous Improvement Work Plan (CIWP). The CIWP lays out the school's goals and priorities for the year, and it is aligned with the school's budget. You can get a copy of the CIWP at www.cps.edu or at your school's main office.
