



Violence is a disease that can be treated with a health model










Bronx Hospital-Based Cure Violence Model

Credible Messengers: Targeting the Highest Risk



High Risk Participants



- 14-25 year olds
- Active in a street organization
- History of violence
- Engaged in high-risk activity
- Weapons carrier
- Recently shot
- Recently released from prison

Fever Block/New Jack Mediation



- Ongoing beef between New Jack & Fever Block
- Formal mediation conducted in office May 27th and 28th
- Hired outreach worker Richard
 James, identified during mediation
- Ongoing follow-up, but no shootings have occurred between these groups
- Have brought participants from both sides together for multiple events

We saw a 53% reduction in shootings in the target areas (47th & 49th precincts) in 2015.

Jacobi Medical Center Violence Prevention Program

HOSPITAL

- Team: Doctor, Social Worker, Hospital Responder
- Respond to all violent trauma: shootings, stabbings, assaults
- Counsel patients/families
- Prevent retaliation
- Ongoing medical/mental health follow-up at outpatient clinic
- Specialized social, educational, vocational, & recreational services
- Patients can become participants

COMMUNITY

- Cure Violence model
- Team: Pastor & Outreach Workers
- Treat highest risk individuals
- Ongoing conflict mediation
- Case load of participants
- Community Engagement
- Canvassing/Shooting Responses
- Change behavior & Community norms
- Covering 3 Bronx precincts, Mount Vernon, Yonkers
