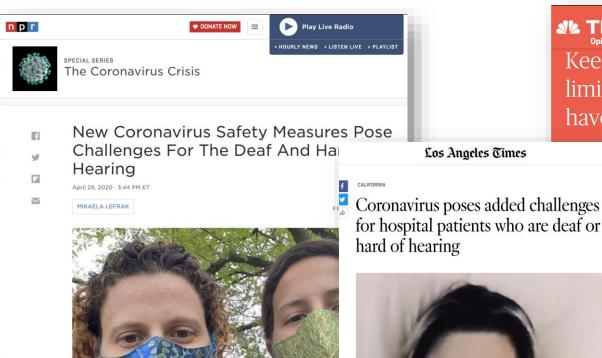

# **Ambulatory care**

- Virtual Health
  - 3 way video visits (allows interpreters to participate) or Zoom calls (for real-time captioning)



- Safe N'Clear
- Clear Communicator
- Communication devices
  - Mobile iPad carts for video remote interpreting or realtime captioning









# Advocating and Empowering DHH Individuals and Caregivers

- Advocate and empower our DHH patients
  - Encourage patients to tell every health care team member about hearing loss
  - Arrange accommodations; double-check prior to appointment

  - PPE for trained interpreters (limited availability)
