Over the past decade, TSUAg has experienced a six-fold increase in undergraduate enrollment and a ten-fold increase in graduate enrollment. Our research-based graduate program is the largest among HBCU agriculture programs and is nationally recognized for its excellence.

TSUAg conducts groundbreaking research in 36 state-of-the-art laboratories and at three Agricultural Research and Education Centers. On a per-faculty basis, TSUAg ranks among the most competitive land-grant institutions in the nation. In the past year, TSUAg faculty contributed 83% of the university's total grant proposals, securing \$47 million in research funding.

TSUAg's Extension Program is the largest among all 1890 land-grant institutions, serving 63 of Tennessee's 95 counties. During the 2023-2024 fiscal year, the program provided educational resources to over 586,000 Tennessee residents, including 312,000 school-age children and youth.

The State Building Commission has approved \$63 million for two new facilities, which are expected to total approximately \$80 million with equipment and support services. Recently, several new research and education support facilities have been opened at the university farm, with additional investments totaling approximately \$20 million.
