THE PEOPLE

insure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defence,
and our Posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution

Article I.
Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.
Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.
No Person shall be a Representative who shall not have attained to the Age of twenty five Years, and been seven Years a Citizen of the United States, and when elected be an Inhabitant of that State in which he shall be chosen.
Representatives and direct Taxes shall be apportioned among the several States which may be included within this Union, according to the actual Enumeration which shall be made within three Years after the first Meeting of the Congress, and within every subsequent Term of seven Years, in such Manner as they shall by Law direct. The Number of Representatives shall not exceed one for every thirty thousand Persons; but no State shall have less than one Representative, and until such Enumeration, New York nineteen, New Jersey seven, Pennsylvania eight, Delaware six, Maryland six, Virginia ten, North Carolina five, South Carolina five, and Georgia three.
That the executive Authority thereof shall be vested in one Person, and that the Judges of the supreme Court shall be appointed as follows, to-wit: The President shall nominate, and by and with the Advice and Consent of the Senate shall appoint and remove such Judges as he shall think proper, but they shall hold their Offices during good Behaviour, and shall, like the Judges of the supreme Court, be removable only on Impeachment.
The Congress shall have Power to lay and collect Taxes, Duties, Imposts and Excises, to regulate Commerce with foreign Nations, among the several States, and with the Indian Tribes; to borrow Money on the Credit of the United States, to emit and put to Pass, and to receive Payment of Money on Demand, of such legal Tender as Congress may from Time to Time order and determine; to regulate the Value of Money, the Weights and Measures; to define and punish Offences against the Law of Nations, and all Crimes and Misdemeanors, except those committed under the Authority of the States; to coin Money, to regulate the Value thereof, and to fix the Standard of Weights and Measures; to provide for the Punishment of Offences against the Law of Nations, and all Crimes and Misdemeanors, except those committed under the Authority of the States; to declare War, to grant Letters of Marque and Reprisal, to raise and support Armies, but no Appropriation of Money for that Purpose shall be for a longer Term than two Years; to provide and maintain a Navy; to make and enforce Laws, not inconsistent with the Constitution and Laws of the United States, and to carry into Execution the same, by all such Name as Congress shall think proper; to issue Letters of Marque and Reprisal, to raise and support Armies, but no Appropriation of Money for that Purpose shall be for a longer Term than two Years; to provide and maintain a Navy; to make and enforce Laws, not inconsistent with the Constitution and Laws of the United States, and to carry into Execution the same, by all such Name as Congress shall think proper.
