### What is Planetary Health?

- ☑ An aspirational state: "the health of human civilisation and the state
  of the natural systems on which it depends."
- A scientific framework: The fusion of biomedical sciences with physical, environmental, and social sciences, based on systems approaches, to investigate health threats of global environmental change and to discover and document solutions.
- ☑ An emerging scientific field: A transdisciplinary research enterprise based at universities, research institutes, and government agencies.
- ☑ A "movement": A growing science-informed movement among members of the public and decision-makers, who recognize existential threats to humanity from the disruption of earth systems and demand practical, evidence-based solutions.

#### **Total Mentions Over Time**





