




## Greater Boston Demographics

Educational Attainment (Boston-Cambridge Metro)





# Pre-pandemic: Boston's middle hollowing out


Change in number of households by household income bucket. Boston, 1980-2017.

# Unemployment remains significantly higher post-COVID 19


#### **Metro Boston Unemployment Rate**

Unemployment Claims – Massachusetts




- Women have fared worse
  - 55% of claimants were women compared to 45% of the workforce
- 39.1% of claimants were under 35 years old compared to 35.4% of the workforce
- 12.6% of claimants were Black or African American compared to 8.7% of the workforce
- During the week of September 19, fewer workers (10,991) were on the new Pandemic Unemployment Assistance Program than the traditional (28,724)


# Percent change in job postings by education Boston metro


# Percent change in job postings: Boston metro vs. nation


Massachusetts Unemployment Claims by Industry







# Boston-Cambridge Metro Internet Access Overview

### **Internet Access**

- 81.2% of all households have a high-speed internet subscription
- 8.1% of all households have internet access through cellular data plans only
- 9.5% of all households have no internet subscription
- 32.5% of households earning less than \$20,000 have no internet subscription

### **Computing Devices**

- 83.2% of all households have a desktop or laptop computer
- 6.2% of all households have a smartphone with no other device
- 5.7% of all households have no computing device
