






[DONE]

We must convene a league of equity-led organizations and employers. We must thrust into the mainstream our "radical" ideas about social justice in tech. We must make ourselves obsolete.



[1] DEVELOP A BODY OF PRINCIPLES. AGITATE FOR THEIR ADOPTION.

- Black and Latinx technologists must codify what it means to employ and advance equitably
- Foment the groundswell: Allies must hold their leadership accountable to their Tweeted values.

[2] MOVE PAST DIVERSITY, TOWARDS EQUITY AND JUSTICE

- It's not about token hiring, it's about power recalibration
- Hiring a PoC into a dead-end job is an example of diversity without power

[3] RETHINK EDUCATION

- Do we, or do we not, have a civil right to top-notch education?
 - If so, it cannot be "affordable." It must be free.

[4] CREATE A LEAGUE OF EQUITY-LED ORGS AND EMPLOYERS

- Abide by the body of principles.
- Eg...
 - Employers: No more BA requirements
 - Orgs: No income-sharing agreements. They are oppressive
- This challenges the "natural tendency of the market." It only works if we organize.

[5] OVERHAUL THE WAY THE FIELD IS FUNDED

- We are funded by leading capitalists, to ameliorate the harmful effects of capitalism
- Philanthropy is another power construct, and it will favor stasis
- Democratization deserves democratic funding
- Corporate equity tax on those who don't abide by the Body of Principles
